the Horn-work at the Port of Havre, the fame was pur in Execution on the 5th infect, about nine in the Morning. by three hundred Granaderra, with four hundred Fufilers, to fuffain them, and four hundred Workmen. Our Men went on with the greatest Gallantry imaginable, and after a Difpute of about half an Hour beat ou the Eremy, and lodged themselves upon the Covered-way. We had about threescore of our fide killed and wounded in this Service; among the latter are Lieutenant-Colonel Hara of the English Artillery. who received a Shot in the Face, and another in the Thigh, and Caprain Petit of the Guards, who was flot through the Arm; but their Wounds are not dangerous. We have fince pertected the faid Lodgment, and a Communication from the Right to the Left. At the Attack of Bertamon, where it was thought ad-vifable to proceed by the Sap, we made Lodgments last Night upon the three Salian. Angles of the Counterscarp, of the Horn work, which our Men are now perfecting, and working upon the Communications; but the Damage done to our Works at both Attacks by the continaed Rains will require time to repair, and fomewhat retard our Approaches. A Convoy of two hundred and fix y Waggons, laden with Ammunition for the Siege arrived Yesterday from Brussels. The Everny continue in their former Camp, and having almost finished their Lines between Valenciennes and Quesnoy, are now building several Forts for their greater Security. The Cheva-lier de Luxembourg remains at the head of a Body of Troops near Charleroy, where he is reinforced from time to time by tresh Troops from the Army. The Prince-Royal of Prossia left the Army this Morniag, in order to his return to Berlin.

From the Camp at Havre, Officher 14. N. S.
