QUEEN'S COMMENDATION FOR VALUABLE SERVICES IN THE AIR

Lieutenant William Anthony McMahon (483973) Royal Corps of Transport

Lieutenant McMahon was the first Officer Commanding of the Aviation Detachment of the British Army Training Unit, Suffield, Canada. In this capacity, he was responsible for setting up the Detachment from scratch as well as organising the procedures necessary for air safety in the range area. This entailed mapping out a system of air routes to ensure the flight safety of aircraft during the periods of live firing which were to follow. This work was to prove invaluable at the height of the training season when range activity was intense.

When training started in June, his detachment began work at full stretch, not only coping with many visitors but primarily in full support of battle group training for safety control, casualty evacuation and tactical flying. In the changeable and unpredictable weather of the prairie, given to violent winds and sudden electrical thunderstorms, the Flight flew by night and day to give excellent support to the battle groups and to the training programme as a whole.
