N Friday the 18th Inflant we began, at the Attack of Bertamont, to remove our Batteries into the Hornwork, in order to batter the Bastions, and continued to work on them with all possible Diligence. On Saturday the 19th in the Morning our Batteries began to fire upon the Face of the Hornwork. at the Gate of Havre, and continued to do fo with very good Success 'till Y sterday about Noon; when the Breaches being almost practicable, and we likewise making Preparations for an Attack, were prevented by the Enemies beating a Parley, and hanging out white Flags at both Attacks, to fignific their Defire to Capitulate; upon which Hosages were exchanged. The Enemy sent out Monfieur de Sonegar, a Major-General; Monfieur Grimaldi, a Brigadier; and Monsieur Lylyer, a Colonel; and we fent into the Town Major-General Wrank, Brigadier Ockinga, and Colonel Alberti. The Hostages having dined with the Prince of Nassau near the Bertamont Attack, came in the Afternoon to the Duke of Mariborough's Quarters, (the Prince of Savoy being there at the fame time) and having delivered in their Propofuls, returned into the Town should give the Wight with the High puffer Angivern into the Town about eight with their Highnesses Answer. They came out again this Morning, and, after some Debates, it was agreed That the Gate of Nimi should be delivered to us, as it was this Evening; and that the Garriionshould march out on Wednesday the 23d; the French to be conducted to Maubeuge, and the Spanish and Bavarian Troops to Namur. 10 at Night. The Articles have been just now figned at the Prince of Savoy's Quarters, by that Prince, the Duke of Marlborough, the Deputies of the States, and the Governor of the Town, and we have taken Possession of the Gate of Nimi with five hundred Men.

Articles for the Surrender of the City of Mons to the High Allies.

HAT the Exercise of the Roman Catholick and Apostolick Religion be preserved entire, without any Change or Innovation, Granted, together with all the Privileges belonging to the Chapter of St. Vaudrue.

II. That the City flall be delivered up to the High Allies at the end of eight Days, beginning from this Day. unless it be relieved within that time by the Army of the two Crowns. The Pert of Nimi shall be delivered up to the High Allies to Morrow, being Monday the 21st Instant, at eleven in the Morning, and the Garrison shall march out on Wednesslay the 23d, at eight in the blorning.

III. Thar, during that Term, all Acts of Hostility shall cease on both sides, and that no Approaches be made, or

IV. That if the City be not relieved before that Term is expired, a Gate shall be given up to the Allies; but to prevent all Diforder, the first Gate on the fide of the City shall continue shur, and be guarded by some Troops of the Garrison, that no Officer or Soldier of the Allies may enter. Answered by the second Article, and a Barrier shall be placed between the two Guards according to Cuffor.

V. That the Duke de Croy, Governor and Grand-Bailift of the Province; the Marquis de Grimaldi, Lieutesant-General and Commander of the City; Don Autonio Grimaldi, second Lieurenant General; the Prince Francis of Nassau, Major General; Don Pedro de Zuniga, Major-General; the Brigadiers or the Infantry and Cavalry, all the Officers, Soldiers, Troopers, Dragoons of the Forces of the two Crewns, and of his Electoral Highness of Barrell Parks of his Company Bavaria, including also the Detachment of his Company of Herie-Guards; the Baron de Giey, Governor; the Aids, Majors, all the Officers of the Chief Governor of the City; all the Officers, Soldiers and others belonging to the Ordinance of the Eight and Ordinance of his Eight and Ordinance of his Eight and Ordinance of the Ordina Ordnance, as well of the two Crowns as of his Electoral Highness of Bayaria; all Engineers and Perions employed in the King's Works; the Count de Bergeyck, Superin-

tendant-General of the Finances, and Secretary of War; Monsieur de Brouchhoven, Intendant of the Finences; Monfieur de la Forge, Receiver-General of the Finances; all the Commissaries of War, Treasurers of the Troops, Directors of the Hospi'als, Provisions and Posts; the Phyficians, Chirurgeons and Apo hecaries, with their Clerks, Attendants and Workmen; and in general, all that are employed in the Service of the two Crowns, without excepting any Person, whether named or not named, shall march our at the Gate of Nimi, to be conducted to the Buissiere, and from thence, the French Troops to march in four Days to Maubeuge, and those of Spain and of his Electoral Highness of Bavaria to Namur, by the shortest way between the Meufe and the Sambre, with Arms, Baggage, Horfes, Footmen, Domesticks, and with their Lift ets, Papers, Moveables and Equipages. Granted, that the Garrison state and their equipeges.

Granted, that the Garrison shall march ont conformably to the former articles, except that the Count de Bergezek and Monsieur de Brouchhoven shall continue as Hostages for adjusting and satisfying the Debts contraded in the City of Mons and Province of Hainault; as also for such Debts as were contracted the last Year in Ghent, the Country of Waes, and the Neighbourhood of those Places, during the time that the faid City of Chent was in their lossession, or give sufficient Security for this Effect. The Marks of Honour are granted to the Garrison, excepting the Cancon and Mertars, and that fix Charges only be allowed to each Sollier.

VI. That Draught Horfes, with their Harness and Waggons, each drawn at least by four Horses, shall be provided at the Expence of the Allies, for transporting to Namur the faid Cannon, Mortars, Ammunition, Equi-pages and Baggage, of the Officers, Soldiers, and as many of the Sick and Wounded as are in a Capacity to travel. Granted, That as many Waggens as are niceffary for the Baggage and the Wounded be allowed them, at the Ex-

pence of the Garrison.

VII. That Don Antonio Grimaldi, second Lieutenant-General, may flay in the Town with his Domenicks, Equipage, Physicians and Surgeons, 'till he be perfectly cured of the Wound he received in the Siege; and that atter his Recovery, a Passport and Guard be given him to retire to Namur, or elsewhere, with his Equipages, Do-

medicks, Phylicians and Surgeons. Granzed.

VIII. That all the other Sick and Wounded Officers, Troopers and Drigoons, who are not in a Condition to march out with the Garrison, shall continue in the City or Mons, and be provided with Lodgings, Beds, Food and Medicines, at the Expence of the High Allies, until they are port it y cured, as they are usually treated in the Holpitals of the two Crowns; as also with Phyticians, Surgeons, and wher Persons employed in the said Hospitals; and accordingly, as they shall be able to travel, they shall be supplied, at the Expence of the Allies, with the necessary Carriages and Paisports to be fately transported to Namor, with thir Footmen and Equipages, or to the next Town. Moveables and Cloaths within fix Months to any other City belonging to the two Crowns, as they shall think convenient; and that Carriages, Passports and Guards for their Security he granted them as they shall have oc-casion. Granted, For three Months, and that the Carriages be provided at their own Charge

XXII. That all the Civil Officers who have any Truft or Employment in the Province, and all the Inhabitants of the City of Mons, may be penalited to retire within fix Months to any of the Territories in Subjection to the two Crowns. with their Families, Effects, Mony, Papers, Moveables and Merchandizes, and that they shall be surnished with Necessaries by the High Allies for their March, as they shall require them. Granted, at their Expence, as
