- prohibit, or vary existing prohibitions on, waiting by any vehicle (subject to specified exemptions) between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on normal weekdays in the roads specified in Part I of Schedule 2 to this notice, or in parts of such roads, or for the whole 24 hours of every day in the roads specified in Part II of Schedule 2 hereto, or in parts of such roads; and
- remove the waiting restrictions in Lorne Road and Sydenham Buildings consequential on road closures there.

In general, all existing exemptions from waiting restrictions will remain unchanged and will equally apply in the additional roads mentioned in Schedule 2 hereto (except as otherwise specified in paragraph 2(c) of this Notice).
