. The Caerphilly Urban District (Ash Grove, Nelson) (No. 2) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that the Caerphilly Urban District Council propose to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

## CORNWALL COUNTY COUNCIL

### The County of Cornwall (Marazion) (Various Streets) (Traffic Regulation) Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that on the 25th July 1973, the Cornwall County Council made an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which is to regulate traffic in the parish of Marazion by:

1. prohibiting, subject to the usual exceptions operating in Cornwall, the waiting of vehicles—

(a) at any time from the 1st June-30th September (both dates inclusive) in each year in any of the lengths of road specified in the First Schedule hereto; and

- (b) for a longer period than 30 minutes in any one hour between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. daily from the 1st June-30th September (both dates inclusive) in each year in either of the lengths of road specified in the Second Schedule hereto.
- 2. amending The County of Cornwall (Marazion) (Various Streets) (Restrictions on Waiting) Order 1972, so that in future the existing 30 minute limit on waiting between 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. daily on that length of the southern side of King's Road (Unclassified) which extends from its eastern junction with the Long Rock— Helston Road (A.394) for a distance of 35 yards in a westerly direction shall operate between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. daily.
- 3. amending The County of Cornwall (North Street, Marazion) (One-Way Traffic) Order 1972, so as to impose one-way traffic from west to east on that length of North Street (Unclassified) from its western junction. tion with the Long Rock—Helston Road (A.394) to a point 53 yards south-east of its junction with Beacon Road.

Copies of the Orders, together with a map showing the lengths of road referred to therein, will be available for public inspection during normal office hours at the County Hall, Truro, and at the West Penwith Rural District Council Offices, 38 Chapel Street, Penzance.

Any person who desires to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in the Order on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the Act or on the ground that any requirement of that section or of section 84A, 84B or 84C of the Act or any regulations made under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of the above date, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
