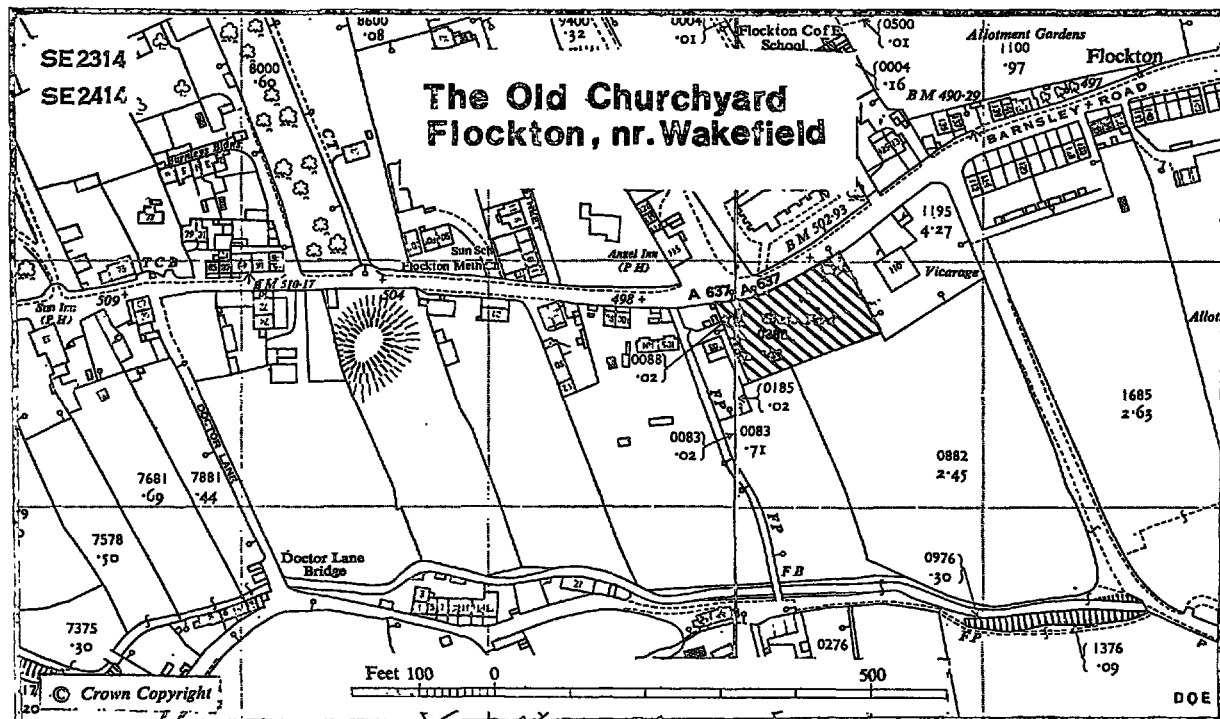
Whereas the Secretary of State for the Environment, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of Flockton with Denby Grange, in the County of the West Riding of Yorkshire, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provision of the Burial Act 1853 as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be dis-

continued forthwith and entirely in the Old Churchyard, Flockton, in the said Parish, as shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 21st day of September next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the *London Gazette*, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 21st day of September.

The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 18) Order 1973.

This Order provides that the goods listed in the schedule shall be temporarily exempt from Import Duty up to and including 31st December 1973 or, in the case of certain items, up to and including 31st October 1973.
