NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH STOPPING-UP AND DIVERSION ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971 SECTION 210

The Birmingham (Woodgate Lane, Bartley Green) Public Path (Stopping-up and Diversion) Order 1973

Notice is hereby given that on the 28th June 1973 the Birmingham City Council confirmed the above-named Order. The effect of the Order as confirmed is:

1. To divert the public right of way more particularly described in Part I of the Schedule hereto to the position more particularly described in Part II of the said Schedule.
2. To extinguish the public rights of way over and along the footpaths more particularly described in Parts III and IV of the Schedule hereto.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the Town Clerk's Department, The Council House, Birmingham, B1 1BB, and may be inspected free of charge at the Town Clerk's Department between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

The Order becomes operative as from the date hereof but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 within 6 weeks from the date hereof make application for the purpose to the High Court.

SCHEDULE

PART I

A footpath having throughout its length an average width of 2 feet 6 inches commencing at a point 57 yards west of Woodgate Lane marked "C" on the map annexed to the Order and extending in a westerly direction for approximately 311 yards to a point marked "B" on the said map.

PART II

Description of Site of Alternative Highway

The footpath shown by bold black dashes on the said map between points "A" and "B" having a length of 417 yards.

PART III

A footpath having throughout its length an average width of 2 feet 6 inches commencing at a point 20 yards west of Woodgate Lane marked "D" on the map annexed to the Order and extending in a westerly direction for approximately 273 yards to a point in Lye Close Lane marked "E" on the said map.

PART IV

A footpath having throughout its length an average width of 2 feet 6 inches commencing at a point in Woodgate Lane marked "F" on the said map and extending in a south-westerly direction for a distance of 137 yards and then in a north-westerly direction for approximately 43 yards to a point in Lye Close Lane marked "G" on the said map.

CORNWALL COUNTY COUNCIL

Cadgwith, Helford and Coverack Conservation Areas

Notice is hereby given that the Cornwall County Council has designated areas of land in the rural district of Kerrier as Conservation Areas pursuant to section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971.

The designated areas are as follows:

- (a) Cadgwith: that part of the village between Little Cove and the Coastguard Lookout and as far north as the Coastguard Station;

- (b) Helford: the village itself from Point Cottage to Treath and as far south as O.S. Nos. 106 and 119;
- (c) Coverack: the area extending from Dolor Point to the footpath between Trevanion Cottages and the Methodist Chapel.

Maps of the designated areas have been deposited at the Kerrier Rural District Council Offices, The Willows, Helston, and at Room 58, County Hall, Truro, and may be inspected between the hours of 9 a.m. to 12.30 p.m. and 2 p.m. to 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

The purposes of designation are to conserve and enhance the architectural and historic character of the designated areas as a whole, and to ensure that special regard is paid to the architectural and visual qualities of the area when proposals for development are under consideration.

GLOUCESTERSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

(ATW 32 Twynning) Public Path Diversion Order 1973

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 10th August 1973, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Gloucestershire County Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish that length of footpath ATW 32 in the Parish of Twynning from its junction with the drive to Twynning Park extending southwards for 250 feet and to create an alternative highway in lieu over a 6 feet wide strip of land from a point 250 feet south-westwards from the junction of footpath ATW 32 with the drive to Twynning Park extending northwards for 200 feet.

A copy of the Order and map contained in it has been deposited at the Cheltenham Rural District Council Offices, 14-17 Imperial Square, Cheltenham, and may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m.-1 p.m. and 2 p.m.-4 p.m. Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the County Solicitor, Gloucestershire County Council, Shire Hall, Gloucester, not later than 23rd September 1973, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Gloucestershire County Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.
