

The Conservation Area is described as follows:

Otterton conservation area includes the whole of the old village centre. All buildings and their curtilages in Fore Street are included while the conservation area extends north-eastwards along Otter Road as far as Flint Cottages, Please Anchoring and Brendon Lane and including the orchards at the rear of Brook Cottage and Rydon Farm. The conservation area also extends eastwards along Bell Street as far as the thatched cottage adjacent to Redcliff on its northern side and the two open fields adjacent to Primley on its southern side. The western boundary is formed by the west bank of the River Otter, while also included are Otterton Barton, the Parish Church of St. Michael and other properties in Church Hill, the Primary School in Maunders Hill and Hazeldene in Leas Road.

The area is considered by the County Council to be of special interest, the character and appearance of which it is desirable to preserve and enhance the future development in this area will be subject to strict planning controls designed to secure the preservation of the character and general improvement of the area.

A plan of the area may be inspected at the St. Thomas Rural District Council Offices, 31 Southernhay East, Exeter, and at County Hall, Exeter (Room G.42) during normal office hours.

NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

*Gloucestershire County Council (FTM 73 Tidenham)
Public Path Diversion Order, 1973*

Notice is hereby given that on the 24th September 1973, the Gloucestershire County Council confirmed the above-named Order, the effect of which is to extinguish that length of footpath FTM 73 in the Parish of Tidenham from its junction with the eastern end of Woodcroft Lane extending south-eastwards for 85 metres and to create an alternative footpath in lieu over a 1 metre wide strip of land commencing from the eastern end of Woodcroft Lane extending eastwards for 77 metres and southwards for 47 metres to reconnect with the footpath FTM 73.

A copy of the Order and map contained in it has been deposited at The Lydney Rural District Council Offices, Lydney, and may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m.-1 p.m. and 2 p.m.-4 p.m. Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

This Order becomes operative from the date on which it is certified by the Gloucestershire County Council that the alternative footpath has been provided, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with he may, under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice apply to the High Court.

The Halifax (Footpath No. 650) Public Path Stopping Up Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 12th September 1973, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Halifax County Borough Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish the public right of way running from a point on the southerly side of Rochdale Road near to Darcey Hey Lane north-westwards to the centre of Rochdale Road.

The Halifax (Forest Avenue/Cousin Lane) Public Path Diversion Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 12th September 1973, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Halifax County Borough Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way running from the north-easterly side of Number 71, Forest Avenue, Halifax, to the north-westerly side of Number 86, Cousin Lane, Halifax, northwards along the westerly side of Forest Avenue then westwards along the southerly side of Moor Lane and then southwards along the easterly side of Cousin Lane so as to join the existing footpath at both ends.

KESTEVEN COUNTY COUNCIL

Kesteven County Council Market Deeping FP2 and FP9 Public Paths Diversion Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that on the 13th September 1973 the Kesteven County Council confirmed without modification the above-mentioned Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert (1) the public right of way leading from Halfleet, Market Deeping, at a point approximately 100 yards south of the junction with Towngate in a south-westerly and southerly direction for approximately 208 yards to a line leading from Halfleet approximately 20 yards north of the commencement of the existing footpath in a westerly and southerly direction for approximately 291 yards then joining the existing footpath (point C) and (2) the public right of way leading from Halfleet, Market Deeping, south of 24 Halfleet at a point approximately 37 yards westwards of Halfleet (point A) in a westerly direction for approximately 84 yards to its junction with the existing footpath described above to a line commencing at the said point A and proceeding southwards for approximately 48 yards and then westwards for approximately 100 yards to the said point C.
