Gloucester Rural District Council (Parish of Moreton Valence) Public Path Diversion Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that on the 14th September 1973, the Gloucester Rural District Council confirmed the above Order.

Its effect is to extinguish part of Footpath EMV.7 over the length of the former Pegthorne Bridge, which originally joined Footpath EMV.8 and the remainder of Footpath EMV.7 on the north-west side of the Gloucester and Berkeley Canal to Footpath EMV.17 and the remainder of Footpath EMV.7 on the south side of the canal (a length of 50 feet), and to replace it with a new footpath commencing at the junction of Footpath EFL.17 with the north-western end of Junction Bridge and continuing along the canal towing path on the north-west side of the aforementioned canal to the northern end of the former Pegthorne Bridge and the junction of Footpaths EMV.7 and 8, a distance of 3,085 feet. This new section of path will be limited at all times to the passing and repassing over and across on foot only.
