Sir John Norris continues still at Spithead, on Board the Ranelagh, with the Nottingham, Elizabeth, Gosport, and Dispatch Brigantine; also the Chichester and Coichester at St. Helens. Yesterday being the 5th of November, a Sermon was preached at the Parish Church, and the Day concluded with all the Rejoicings suitable to the Occasion.
