Section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 7 a.m. and 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. Mondays to Fridays on the under-mentioned lengths of road:

- 1. Duke Street, on the southerly side for a distance of 470 ft. from its junction with Kings Road in a westerly direction.
- 2. On the three sides of the traffic island at the junction of Duke Street with Kings Road, being a total of 300 ft.
- 3. Kings Close on the north side for a distance of 110 ft. from its junction with Kings Road, in a westerly direction.
- 4. Formby Street, on both sides, for a distance of 50 ft. from its junction with Duke Street, in a southerly direction.

The Order contains exemptions to allow waiting for the purposes of picking up and setting down passengers, load-ing or unloading goods, roadworks, building or demolition operations, the maintenance of essential services, the collection and delivery of postal packets and exemptions relating to invalid carriages and disabled drivers.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the lengths of road affected may be inspected at the Council Offices, Formby, during normal office hours.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order may, within six weeks from the 16th October 1973, apply to the High Court for the purpose. The Order comes into force on the 30th November

1973.
