

## LEAMINGTON SPA ROYAL BOROUGH COUNCIL

## CLEAN AIR ACT, 1956

*The Royal Leamington Spa No. 15 Smoke Control Order*  
1973

Notice is hereby given that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Royal Leamington Spa in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on the 23rd October 1973 made an Order entitled the "Royal Leamington Spa No. 15 Smoke Control Order 1973" declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if on any day after the Order has come into operation smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

Fireplaces in buildings or parts of buildings separately occupied without gas supply shall be exempted from the operation of section 11 of the said Act on condition that only authorised fuels as declared by regulations made under the said Act and kindling sticks and paper shall be used in the fireplaces.

If confirmed, the Order will not come into operation before the 1st November 1974, or before a later date determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Clerk's Office, Town Hall, Royal Leamington Spa, at all reasonable times during the period of 6 weeks from the 2nd November 1973.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

## THE SCHEDULE

All that area of land comprising approximately 190 acres or thereabouts in the Borough of Royal Leamington Spa bounded on the west by the Borough boundary, on the south by the River Leam, on the north by the Borough boundary and part of Smoke Control Area No. 1, and on the east by the west side of Guys Cliffe Road all of which said area of land is delineated and coloured green on the map referred to in the Order.

## ROTHERHAM COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

*Greasbrough No. 3 Smoke Control (Variation) Order*,  
1973

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the County Borough of Rotherham (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on the 29th October 1973, made an Order entitled the County Borough of Rotherham Greasbrough No. 3 Smoke Control (Variation) Order, 1973 (hereinafter referred to as "the Variation Order") which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation.

The effect of the Variation Order will be to take the properties listed in the Schedule hereto out of the operation of the County Borough of Rotherham Greasbrough No. 3 Smoke Control Order, 1971 (hereinafter referred to as "the 1971 Order"), which was confirmed with modification by the Secretary of State for the Environment on the 10th April 1972.

The properties are to be excluded from the operation of the 1971 Order because they are affected by the slum

clearance programme of the Council and are therefore expected to continue to be occupied only for a limited period of time.

If the Variation Order is confirmed by the Secretary of State for the Environment it will come into operation on the date on which it is confirmed.

A copy of the Order may be inspected free of charge at the Municipal Offices, Howard Street, Rotherham, at all reasonable times during the period of 6 weeks from the 9th November 1973.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary, Department of the Environment, Tothill Street, London, SW1H 9JY, object to the confirmation of the Order.

## STOURBRIDGE BOROUGH COUNCIL

## CLEAN AIR ACT, 1956

*Stourbridge No. 34 Smoke Control Order* 1973

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of Stourbridge in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act 1956, on the 23rd October 1973, made an Order entitled the Stourbridge No. 34 Smoke Control Order 1973, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area.

Subject to the limitations and exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the Smoke Control Area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of the smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed, the Order will not come into operation before the 1st October 1974, or before a later date determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

Copies of the Order and the map referred to may be inspected free of charge at the Public Health Department, Council House, Stourbridge, at all reasonable times during the period of 6 weeks from the 9th November 1973.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary, Department of the Environment, Whitehall, London, SW1H 9JY, object to the confirmation of the Order.

## SCHEDULE

That part of the Borough situated in the Wollaston district containing an area of approximately 103 acres bounded to the north by rear boundaries of 32-48 Park Road; side boundaries of Longcroft and Lyndale, High Park Avenue; the rear boundaries of 2-50 Park Road West; side boundaries of 31 Fir Grove; front boundaries of 23-29 Fir Grove and 1-11 Wildacres; side of 11 Wildacres and rear boundaries of 29 and 31 Fir Grove and 78-86 Park Road West and side boundary of High Park County Secondary School; to the west by the Borough boundary; to the south by Dunsley Road and South Road; and the east by Studley Gate and the side boundary of 32 Park Road.
