THE CAPITAL GAINS TAX (EXEMPT GILT-EDGED SECURITIES) (No. 3) ORDER 1973

In accordance with section 41 (2) of the Finance Act 1969 the Treasury give notice that an Order entitled The Capital Gains Tax (Exempt Gilt-Edged Securities) (No. 3) Order

1973 has been made under the provisions of that Act and section.

This Order adds the following gilt-edged securities to the category of stocks and bonds which are exempt from tax on capital gains if held for more than 12 months:

- 8% Treasury Stock 1975
- 10½% Treasury Stock 1976

The Order has been published as Statutory Instrument 1973 No. 1769.

Whereas the Secretary of State for the Environment, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of Bussage, Stroud, in the County of Gloucester, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in St. Michael and All Angels Churchyard, in the said Parish, shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

Provided that—

In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 17th day of December next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the *London Gazette*, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 17th day of December.
