TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971, SECTION 210
The City of Gloucester (Footpath No. 69) (Part) (No. 1)
Public Path Diversion Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 8th November 1973, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Gloucester County Borough Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that part of Footpath No. 69 at Podsmead running between points shown marked A and B on the map attached to the Order to a line running between points shown and marked C and D on the said map.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the Guildhall, Eastgate Street, Gloucester, and may be inspected free of charge at the Guildhall between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Town Clerk, Guildhall, Eastgate Street, Gloucester, not later than 13th December 1973 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Gloucester County Borough Council may, instead of submitting the Order for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

The Hampshire (Eastleigh Footpath No. 11)
Public Path Diversion Order, 1972

Notice is hereby given that on 2nd November 1973 the Hampshire County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

SCHEDULE

PART I

Description of Site of Existing Path

That footpath in the Borough of Eastleigh shown on the Definitive Map of Public Rights of Way prepared under the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, as Footpath No. 11, running from the rear of 25 Verona Road in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 228 yards to its junction with Footpath No. 13.

PART II

Description of Site of Alternative Highway

A tarmacadam footpath from the rear of 25 Verona Road in an easterly direction for approximately 73 yards, then in a northerly direction for approximately 132 yards and

then in a north-easterly direction for 80 yards and finally in an easterly direction for 40 yards to Footpath No. 13 at the pedestrian underpass, under the Otterbourne-Chandlersford By-pass, a total distance of 325 yards. (490)

The County of Northumberland (Footpaths Nos. 12 and 13, Cramlington) Public Path Diversion Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 1st November 1973, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Northumberland County Council.

If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

Nottinghamshire County Council (North Collingham No. 3)
Public Path Diversion Order 1973

The above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 15th November 1973, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Nottinghamshire County Council as an unopposed Order.
