MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE, FISHERIES AND FOOD

THE IMPORTED FOOD REGULATIONS 1968, AS AMENDED

Hong Kong: Official Certificate

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food gives notice that in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Imported Food Regulations 1968 (S.I. 1968 No. 97) as amended by the Imported Food (Amendment) Regulations 1973 (S.I. 1973 No. 1351) he hereby recognises for the purpose of the importation of meat products from Hong Kong the Official Certificate of the design shown in Part I of the Schedule hereto as showing (i) that the meat from which the meat product to which it relates was prepared, was derived from mammals inspected before and after death at a United Kingdom approved establishment and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Minister, and (ii) that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the meat product was carried out with all the necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.

Where the Certificate is in the form of a label the recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the meat product or the package containing the meat product and if the label has not in any circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate; and where the Official Certificate is in the form of a stamp, the recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed or otherwise marked on the meat product and the package containing the meat product.

Recognition of the Official Certificate is restricted to the extent indicated in Part II of the Schedule hereto.

PAY BOARD

COUNTER-INFLATION ACT 1973

The Restriction of Remuneration (Clay Cross Urban District Council) Order 1973

In exercise of their powers under section 7 (3) of, and paragraph 1 of Schedule 3 to, the Counter-Inflation Act 1973 and all other powers enabling them in that behalf the Pay Board hereby make the following Order:

1. This Order applies in the manner described in paragraph 2 of this Order to the increase in remuneration implemented on or about 28th September 1973 of certain employees of the Clay Cross Urban District Council, such employees being:

- (i) manual workers in Grades D, E and F recognised by the National Joint Council for Local Authorities' Services (manual workers); and
- (ii) craftsmen and electricians recognised by the Joint Negotiating Committee for Local Authorities' Services (engineering craftsmen).

2. The increase in remuneration referred to in paragraph 1 of this Order shall be restricted in relation to the employees referred to in that paragraph so long as this Order remains in force in the following respect:

flat-rate bonus payments shall be restricted to 10 per cent of basic weekly rates, so however that no such flat-rate bonus payment shall be made to any such employee who was not in receipt of such payment immediately before the increase in remuneration implemented on or about 28th September 1973.

3. This Order shall come into force on 16th November 1973.
