

COUNTER-INFLATION ACT 1973

In the matter of a letter dated 19th October 1973 from you the Managing Director, G. P. Banbury Limited, to the Pay Board, stating an intention to increase minimum hourly rates to be paid to employees of G. P. Banbury Limited to 90p per hour.

The Pay Board in exercise of their powers under section 7 (4) of the Counter-Inflation Act 1973, hereby give notice that the Board intend after the expiry of a period of fourteen days from 16th November 1973 to make an Order restricting the rates referred to in the said letter to an amount not exceeding the rates payable in accordance with the provisions of the Counter-Inflation (Price and Pay Code) No. 2 Order 1973 (S.I. 1973, No. 1785).

PRIVATE LEGISLATION PROCEDURE (SCOTLAND) ACT 1936

Notice is hereby given in terms of section 1 (4) of the Private Legislation Procedure (Scotland) Act 1936 that the Secretary of State, the Chairman of Committees of the House of Lords and the Chairman of Ways and Means in the House of Commons having considered representations by the Clerical, Medical and General Life Assurance Society that it is expedient that the undermentioned Parliamentary powers to be operative in Scotland and elsewhere which the Society desire to obtain should be conferred by one enactment have decided that the said powers would more properly be obtained by the promotion of a Private Bill than

by the promotion of a Private Bill and of a Provisional Order under the said Act.

To incorporate the Clerical, Medical and General Life Assurance Society. To provide for the transfer to the incorporated Society of the property and assets of the existing Society, for the continuance by the incorporated Society of the business and undertaking of the existing Society, for the saving of contracts and actions, for the existing directors, auditors and staff to continue in office and for other matters incidental and supplementary to the incorporation of the Society. To repeal the Clerical, Medical and General Life Assurance Acts of 1850 and 1887 and some of the provisions of the Clerical, Medical and General Life Assurance Act 1961. To amend the Laws and Regulations applying to the existing Society and to apply the amended Laws and Regulations to the incorporated Society.
