

under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

This Order, which makes it unlawful for you to drive your vehicle into that part of the carriageway of the link road from Parkgate Road to Liverpool Road, marked by cross-hatched yellow lines, bounded by a yellow line, unless the vehicle is able to be driven immediately and wholly out of the area, comes into operation on the 26th November 1973.

Exceptions will permit vehicles being used for police, fire or ambulance purposes.

A copy of the Order and a map showing the restricted area are available at the Town Hall, Chester, where they may be examined between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from the 15th November 1973, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
