and vehicles waiting in connection with any building operation would not be affected by these no waiting restrictions.

Finally there would be no left turn from St. Peters Way into Black Lion Hill (i.e. at the traffic lights) since vehicles proceeding from St. Peters Way towards West Bridge now use the left hand filter road.
