Westgate Street on the south-west side from the junction with Cowbridge Road East to a point 250 feet south-east of the said junction.

The City and County Borough of Cardiff (Chestnut Road) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that on the 22nd November 1973, the Council of the City and County Borough of Cardiff made the above-named Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

This Order, which makes it unlawful subject to certain exceptions to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in Chestnut Road on the north side from the junction with Plasmawr Road to a point 50 feet west of that junction and on the south side from the junction with Plasmawr Road to a point 260 feet south-west of that junction, will come into operation on the 25th November 1973.

Sides of Road in the City and County Borough of Cardiff

Churchill Way, on the south-west side from a point 90 feet south of the junction with Queen Street to a point 120 feet south of that junction.

Talbot Street East, on the south side from a point 30 feet east of the junction with Cathedral Road to a point 78 feet east of that junction.

Wood Street, abutting the north side of the central reservation from a point 110 feet south-west of the junction with Havelock Street to a point 150 feet south-west of that junction.
