

Order. The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the Public Right of Way running from the north-east corner of O.S. Parcel No. 226 and running along the eastern boundary of that parcel to the south-eastern corner to a line running from the same point and running south-westerly for approximately 140 feet and thence southerly for approximately 380 feet along St. Michael's Way and thence south-easterly for approximately 170 feet to the south-east corner of O.S. Parcel No. 226.

Notice is hereby given that on the 9th November 1973, the Secretary of State for the Environment confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to create a public footpath from the Newcastle-Carlisle Trunk Road (A.69) northwards between the Newcastle-Carlisle railway line and the Tippalt Burn to join the Pennine Way near a row of cottages known as Thirlwall View, a total distance of 625 yards at Greenhead in the Parish of Greenhead in the Rural District of Haltwhistle.

Stour Provost in the County of Dorset*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on the 3rd December 1973, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the Shaftesbury Rural District Council.

The effect of the Order will be to extinguish part of Footpath No. 73, marked blue on the map, at point "B" commencing at the entrance to The Mill yard and running in a south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 25 yards and thence curving in a northerly direction for a further 25 yards to point "C" at the north-east corner of The Old Mill building; and to substitute: a footpath marked red on the map, at point "B" commencing at the entrance to The Mill yard and running in a northerly direction for a distance of 20 yards to the north corner of the stable building at point "X" and thence in a westerly direction for a further 25 yards to point "C" at the north-east corner of The Old Mill building, where it rejoins with footpath No. 73. A footpath commencing at point "C" and running in a westerly direction to point "D" and then in a southerly direction to point "E" to make a link with Mill Lane. National Grid Reference 791215.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Bimport, Shaftesbury, Dorset, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

Compensation for depreciation or damage in consequence of the coming into operation of this Order is payable in accordance with section (31) (113 (2)) of the 1959 Act, to which reference should be made.

Any objection or representation concerning the Order may be sent in writing to the Clerk of the Council, Shaftesbury Rural District Council, Council Offices, Bimport, Shaftesbury, before 11th January 1974.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Shaftesbury Rural District Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

Notice is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 30th November 1973, and if no objections are received or if any objections received are subsequently withdrawn within the time and in the manner specified below, the Order will be confirmed by the Council in accordance with the procedure set out in the Countryside Act 1968.

Its effect will be to divert the length of footpath commencing at the north-west corner of field O.S. 124 some 275 yards north-west of Ashorne Hill Farm in the parish of Newbold Pacey and running in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 235 yards to a point on the southern boundary of the said field, to a line commencing at the field gate some 92 yards south of the first-mentioned point and proceeding in an east-south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 210 yards to the point on the southern boundary of the said field where the existing footpath enters field O.S. 123.
