Gloucestershire County Council (FTM.19 Tidenham) Public Path Diversion Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 26th November 1973, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Gloucestershire County Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish that length of footpath FTM.19 situate at Tintern Quarry in the Parish of Tidenham from its junction with Offa's Dyke Footpath FTM.104 north of Dannel Hill (Grid reference ST.549:978) extending north-westwards for 480 metres and to create an alternative highway in lieu over a 1.2 metres wide strip of land from a point 250 metres north of the junction of footpath FTM.19 with footpath FTM.104 extending generally north-north-westwards for 450 metres to connect with footpath FTM.20.

A copy of the Order and map contained in it has been deposited at the Lydney Rural District Council Offices, Lydney, and may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m.-1 p.m. and 2 p.m.-4 p.m. Mondays to Fridays inclusive.
