The Trunk Road (Various Roads, Boston) (Prohibition of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 1973

The Secretary of State for the Environment proposes to make an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 on the Norman Cross-Grimsby Trunk

Road (A.16).

The effect of the Order will be to extend the existing waiting prohibition to a further part of the south-east side of London Road from a point 38 yards north-east of its junction with Wyberton West Road to 106 yards northwest of that junction and to prohibit waiting, loading and unloading on the north-west side from a point 30 yards south-west of its junction with the south side of Wyberton Low Road to a point 38 yards north-east of its junction with Wyberton West Road.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle except where otherwise stated, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The Trunk Road (Various Roads, Cockermouth) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting, Loading and Unloading)

The Secretary of State for the Environment proposes to to make on Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit the loading and unloading of any vehicle on the north-west side of that length of the Workington-Penrith-Middlesbrough Trunk Road (A.66), known as Market Place and Castlegate, which lies in the Urban District of Cockermouth in the county of Cumberland and which extends from 80 yards north-east of the eastern abutment of Cocker Bridge to the eastern abutment of the said bridge, between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 9.30 a.m., 12 noon and 1.30 p.m. and 4 p.m. and 6 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The Trunk Road (Hooley, Surrey) (Prohibition of Waiting and Restriction of Loading and Unloading) Order 1974

The Secretary of State for the Environment proposes to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit waiting at any time and to prohibit loading and unloading between the hours of 8 a.m. to 9.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. to 6.30 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday, on that length of the London-Brighton Trunk Road (A.23), known as Brighton Road in the Urban District of Banstead, in the county of Surrey, which extends from 457 yards north of its junction with Star Lane to 162 yards north of its junction with Dean Lane.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, except during the hours specified above, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The Trunk Road (Great North Road, Stannington, Northumberland) (Prohibtion of Right-Hand Turn) Order 1973.

The Secretary of State for the Environment has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act

1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

The effect of the Order, which comes into operation on 19th December 1973, is to prohibit right-hand turns from the London-Edinburgh-Thurso Trunk Road (A.1), known as the Great North Road at Stannington, which lies in the Rural District of Castle Ward, Northumberland, into the unclassified road (U.9065) leading in a south-easterly direction to the Ridley Arms Public House.

Any person who desires to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in, the Order, on the ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of, or of any instrument made under, any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of 13th December 1973 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

HIGHWAYS ACTS 1959 TO 1971

The Liverpool-Skegness Trunk Road (Horncastle Internal Relief Road Side Roads) Order 1973

The Secretary of State for the Environment hereby gives notice that, after holding a Public Inquiry in relation to the above mentioned Trunk Road at Horncastle in the county of Lincoln, Parts of Lindsey, he has made under section 9 of the Highways Act 1959 an Order, the effect of which is:
