ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967—SECTION 1

The County of East Sussex (Various Roads) (Weight Restriction) Order 1974

Notice is hereby given that the East Sussex County Council propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968. The effect of the Order will be to prohibit any commercial vehicle, the unladen weight of which exceeds 3 tons, from being driven in any of the lengths of roads specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exceptions will be included in the Order to permit the conveyance of persons, goods or merchandise to or from any premises situated on or adjacent to the roads; to enable a vehicle to be used for the purpose of agriculture; to permit the conveyance or haulage of timber; and to maintain the roads or the services therein.

A copy of the draft Order, together with a plan showing the proposal and a statement of the County Council's reason for proposing to make the Order may be examined at my office between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive until the 18th January 1974.

Any objection to the proposal, together with the grounds on which it is made, should be sent to me in writing not later than that date.

The County of East Sussex (Road at Lewes) (Width Restriction) Order 1974

SUTTON COLDFIELD BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Sutton Coldfield (Mere Green Off-Street Parking Place) Order, 1974

Notice is hereby given that the Sutton Coldfield Borough Council propose to make an Order under section 31 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, further to control the use of the Lichfield Road, Mere Green Off-Street Parking Place. SUTTON COLDFIELD BOROUGH COUNCIL

Borough of Sutton Coldfield (One Way Traffic) (No. 8) Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that on the 20th December 1973, the Sutton Coldfield Borough Council made the above-named Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.
