To the QUEEN'S most Excellent Majesty.

The humble Address of the Bailiffs, Burgesses and Commonalty of your Majesty's ancient Borough and Corporation of *Dunwich*, in the County of *Suffolk*.

May it please your Majesty,

It is with Hearts and Minds full of Affection and Duty that we make this humble Address to your Majesty, to Congratulate you upon the late great and mighty Victory your Majesty's Arms, in Conjunction with those of your High Allies, have lately obtained over the French in the wonderful Battle fought near Mons, and upon the rest of the great Successes of the last Campaign, which hath filled the World with Admiration, and our Hearts with the humblest and greatest Thankfulness to Almighty God, and to your Majesty for your continual Care for the good of your People.

These and the amazing Successes of former Years Abroad, and the Noble Acts for the Good of your People that have been accomplished here in your auspicious Reign, have made you a Terror to your Enemies Abroad, and the Delight and Desire of your People of these Kingdoms, and will justly fill History with such Truths, as will be the Wonder of after Ages.

It is your Majesty's wise Choice of as great a General as ever God blessed the World with (the Duke of Marlborough) the Wisdom and Conduct of your Councils and Ministry, that have procured these Blessings upon your Majesty and your People.

And therefore we look upon it our Duty humbly to assure your Majesty, that we will, to our utmost, assist you to obtain that glorious End your great Mind is pursuing, (viz.) so to humble that lofty Monarch, your Enemy, as to oblige him to submit to an honourable and lasting Peace: Which, that your Majesty may do, and long live to enjoy the Glory of, are the daily Prayers of us and all your good Subjects. Given under our Common Seal at our Guildhall, the 12th Day of November, in the Eighth Year of your Reign.

Which Addresses her Majesty received very graciously.

Milan, Novem. 9. N. S. The Bishop of the five Churches continues at a Country Seat four Miles distant from this City. The Imperial Troops are in full March towards their Winter Quarters, which are in the *Vigevan*, the *Novarrois*, the *Pavese* and the *Cremonese*. They who are to be Quartered in the *Modenesi*, the *Farnese*, and the *Platantin*, are far inferior in number to what those Countries have been charged with in former Years, though at present the Ecclesiastical State be entirely exempted from receiving any. Count *Thaun* arrived at this City on the 6th Instant, and will speedily return to Vienna. Advices from *Genoa* say, that it was reported, by Vessels from *Barcelona*, that Count *Staremberg* was returned into *Aragon*, had taken the City of *Balbastro* by Surprise, and deluged to Winter

most of his Troops in that Kingdom. Letters from *Venice* say, that the Republick had promised an Abatement of ten in the Hundred, to all such as should pay the Equivalent of their Taxes in Corn, that the Magazines and Publick Store-houses of the City may be still supplied with that Commodity. We are advised from *Rome*, that the Partisans of the Duke of *Anjou* continue to Sue our Bulls, and Sollicit for Benefices of his Holiness, notwithstanding the Manifesto of *Monseur Molinez*, which was Published by Order of the Court of *Madrid*. Cardinal *Gualteri* is gone to his Bishoprick of *Todi*. Cardinal *Ruffo* will speedily set out for *Ravenna*. It is believed, that the Pope will intercede with his Catholick Majesty for restoring the Inheritances of the Prince of *Borghese's* Family in the Kingdom of *Catalonia*; and will also endeavour to reconcile that Prince to the Interests of the House of *Austria*.

Hamburg, November 15. N. S. We have received certain Advices, that the King of *Denmark* designs to besiege *Landskroon*, and is making the necessary Dispositions to invest it. The Dutchies of *Gottorp* and *Skf-wigh* are very much alarmed at this Rupture between *Denmark* and *Sweden*; and they have concerted such Measures as they think will be most proper for their own Security, and have given Instructions that the Militia of the Country be in continual readiness to March on the first Notice. Advices from *Berlin* say, that his Prussian Majesty returned on the 9th Instant to *Schwed* from the Conferences at *Marieawerder*, and was expected in that City on the 13th or 14th. General *Schlund*, who accompanied the King of *Prussia* to *Marieawerder*, hath entered himself in the Service of his Czarish Majesty, and it is said that the Direction of the Artillery in the Siege of *Riga* will be committed to him. Letters from *Poland* advise, that King *Augustus* had determined in a Council of Senators, to assemble a General Diet of the Nobility of that Kingdom; and Orders were given that due Notices be accordingly dispersed to the respective Palatinates, to signify his Majesty's Return, and to appoint *Warlaw* for the Place of their Session. King *Augustus* is speedily expected in that City; and they hope that his Majesty's Presence will perfectly compose those Differences, which have so long distracted the State, and disturbed the Peace of the Commonwealth. His Majesty hath lately disposed of several important Offices, and hath confirmed that of Chancellor of the Crown to the Bishop of *Warmia*. It is reported, that the most considerable of those who continue to oppose King *Augustus's* Re-establishment, are retiring with the Forces under their Command towards *Hungary*. There is no certain Account of the King of *Sweden*; some Advices say that his Majesty continued at *Bender*, where he was treated with great Respect; and that Prince *Mazeppa*, the General of the *Cossacks*, died there on the 3d of the last Month of a Malignant Fever; but by other Letters we are informed, that his Majesty is actually set out towards his own Dominions, but it is uncertain which way he will return to *Sweden*.

Brussels, November 22. N. S. The Law-suit between the King of *Prussia* and the Prince *Nassau* of *Friseland* concerning some Lands in *Brabant*, formerly belonging to his late Majesty King *William*, hath been decided in favour of the Prince. Frequent Consultations have been held in this City concerning the Affairs of the Town of *Mons*, and Province of *Hainault*. The last Advices from *Paris* say, that the Duke of *Bavaria* had visited the Palaces of *Malli* and *Versailles*, and returned to that City on the 16th Instant. It is uncertain when that Prince will return to *Compiegne*. The French King hath ordered the State of the Finances, and the Accounts of the Revenues of the Crown, to be laid before him. *Monsieur des Marets* hath, on this Occasion, made it appear to the Council, that his Majesty's Income was sunk fifteen Millions of the usual Revenue in the Year 1708, and twenty Millions in this present

present Year; and that the Expedient of Re-coining the Money, and advancing the Value of the new Species, had not tended so much to the King's Advantage, as was proposed. The general Want of Credit as well as plenty throughout the Kingdom hath exceedingly increased the Difficulties which the King's Ministers meet withal in settling and levying the Funds for the ensuing Year; and notwithstanding their utmost Application, it is thought impossible that the necessary Sums should be raised for the Service, especially since they had Advices that the Spanish Gallions would hardly be in a Condition to sail for Europe this Winter.

Falmouth, November 16. On the 12th Instant came into a Sandy Place in the Parish of Cubert on the North Channel, a Ship laden with Tobacco from Virginia, six French-men being on Board, and is made a Wreck by the Country People. They report, that she was taken by a French Privateer, and taken and carried into Ireland; it is believed the Ship was stolen out of the Harbour. From Mount's-bay we are informed, that on the 12th a Swede laden with Salt from France was lost near the Lizard. Yesterday arrived the Mercury Packet-boat, Capt. Green Commander, in five Days from Lisbon.

Plymouth, November 18. This day arrived her Majesty's Ship the Portland, with the Colchester of and for London, in eight Weeks and two Days from Jamaica; they parted about three Weeks since from Admiral Wager in the Monmouth, with the Jersey and four Merchant-ships. At the same time came in the Vallour from Newfoundland; she parted eleven days since from the Litchfield; and fourteen Merchant-ships.
