#### HIGHWAYS ACT 1959

*The M42 Birmingham—Nottingham Motorway (Monkspath to Coleshill Side Roads Variation) Order, 1974*

The Secretary of State for the Environment hereby gives notice that he has made the following Order:

An Order under section 13 of the above Act the effect of which is to vary the M42 Birmingham—Nottingham Motorway (Monkspath to Coleshill Side Roads) Order, 1972, so as to authorise the Secretary of State to stop up part of a road and of a footpath, improve part of that footpath, and vary the line of a proposed new footpath at Coleshill in the county of Warwick.

#### HIGHWAYS ACTS, 1959 TO 1971

*The Stowmarket to Claydon By-Pass (Private Means of Access) Order, 1973*

#### LAND DRAINAGE ACT 1930

*Lincolnshire and Trent River Authorities Variation of the Stowe Inclosure Award*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by sections 8 (3) and 14 of the Land Drainage Act 1930, as applied by the Water Resources Act 1963, has now made an Order confirming a Scheme submitted to him by the Lincolnshire and Trent River Authorities under section 8 (1) of the Land Drainage Act 1930 for varying the land drainage provisions of the Stowe Inclosure Award.

The Order will become final and have effect as an Act of Parliament unless during the period of 30 days from the date of publication of this notice a memorial is presented to the Minister by some person or body affected and having an interest sufficient for the presentation of a memorial (as prescribed in Article 6 of the Land Drainage (River Authorities) General Regulations 1965, S.I. 1965/443) praying that the Order shall be subject to special parliamentary procedure.

#### THE IMPORTED FOOD REGULATIONS 1968, AS AMENDED

##### *Spain: Official Certificate*

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Imported Food Regulations 1968 (S.I. 1968 No. 97) as amended by the Imported Food (Amendment) Regulations 1973 (S.I. 1973 No. 1351) hereby restricts recognition of the Official Certificate reproduced in the First Schedule to the Notice published in the *London Gazette* dated 19th March 1970 for the importation of meat and meat products from Spain, to the extent shown in the Schedule hereto.

The Notice published in the *London Gazette* dated 10th August 1973 is hereby revoked.
