

*Falmouth, December 3.* Yesterday put in here the *St. Antony of Genoa* from Cadiz, with Wine and Fruit for Amsterdam. The Mercury Packet-boat continues in our Harbour, by reason of Southerly Winds. The *Gencele* brings an Account, that the *New-Invention*, a Privateer of forty four Guns, is taken by an English Man of War.

*Plimouth, December 4.* This Day arrived the *Friendship* of this Place from Lisbon, with Fruit for London; and the *Hope* of Amsterdam for Rochel.

*Hull, December 5.* Last Saturday in the Afternoon arrived our Trade from Rotterdam, consisting of eight or ten Sail, under Convoy of the *Salisbury Prize*, which is now in the *Humber*.

*Tarmouth, December 5.* Her Majesty's Ship the *Dunwich* came lately into our Road from the Southward, and is now here with the *Falkstone* and *Advice's Prize*.

*Portsmouth, December 5.* On Sunday last her Majesty's Ship the *Nonsuch* sailed to the Westward, and the *Oxford* sailed into the Harbour. Sir John Norris with her Majesty's Squadron continues still at Spithead. We have had very stormy Weather for some Days, which still continues.

*Deale, December 6.* Here are her Majesty's Ships the *Ruffel*, *Dragon*, *Loe*, *Strombulo* and *Swan*; and also three outward-bound and five Store-ships.

There are two Mails due from Holland.
