DARLINGTON COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

The County Borough of Darlington (Bondgate/St. Augustine's Way) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1974

Notice is hereby given that on the 7th March 1974 the Darlington County Borough Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

The effect of the Order is to prohibit the waiting by all types of vehicles at all times on the lengths of roads specified in the First Schedule to this notice and between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on the length of roads specified in the Second Schedule to this notice.

Exceptions have been made in the Order for loading and unloading of vehicles, for passengers to board and alight from vehicles and for street works to be carried out.

This Order will come into operation on the 28th March 1974. A copy of the Order and a map showing the lengths of roads to which it relates may be inspected at the Borough Solicitor's Office, Town Hall, Darlington during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the power conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order you may, within six weeks from the 7th March 1974 apply to the High Court for this purpose.

DERBY COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

The County Borough of Derby (Prohibition of Waiting) (Upperdale Road) Order 1974

Notice is hereby given that on the 8th day of March 1974 the Council of the County Borough of Derby made an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

The Order which comes into effect on the 7th April 1974 prohibits any vehicle from waiting at all times on both sides of Upperdale Road and Church Street and for a distance of 45 feet from those roads along the streets joining Upperdale Road and Church Street.

Exceptions to the restriction referred to in paragraph 2 above will permit waiting where necessary for the purposes of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) loading or unloading goods;

- (c) the maintenance of roads;
- (d) the supply of electricity and water;
- (e) the laying and maintenance of G.P.O. cables;
- (f) to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water, air from a garage;
- (g) to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with weddings or funerals.

A copy of the Order and the map showing the lengths of streets affected may be examined at the Town Clerk's Office, Council House, Corporation Street, Derby, during normal office hours.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within six weeks from the 8th March 1974 apply to the High Court for this purpose.

DERBYSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The Derbyshire County Council (Various Streets, Eckington) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1974

Notice is hereby given that the Derbyshire County Council propose to make an Order, under section 1 (1), (2), (3) and 84 (d) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968.

When this Order comes into effect you will not be allowed to leave your vehicle on the following lengths of road in the Parish of Eckington in the Rural District of Chesterfield.

Waiting prohibited at all times on:

High Street (part)—Market Street and Church Street (part)

From a point about 60 yards south-west of the junction with Stead Street in a north-easterly direction to a point 33 yards north-east of the junction with Castle Hill.

Castle Hill

From its junction with Church Street in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 30 yards.

Southgate

From its junction with Market Street in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 145 yards.

Station Road

From its junction with Southgate in an easterly direction for a distance of 50 yards.

Gosber Street

From its junction with Market Street in a southerly direction for a distance of 33 yards.

NOTE. It is proposed to revoke the Derbyshire County Council (Various Streets, Eckington) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1964.
