# CHELTENHAM BOROUGH COUNCIL

### The Borough of Cheltenham (Central Area) (Experimental) Order 1973

Notice is hereby given that the Cheltenham Borough Council by an Order made on the 22nd March 1974 under section 9 (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 have directed that the above-named Experimental Order shall continue in force until the 4th November 1974.

- There is no change in the effect of the Order, the effect of which is as follows:
  - (a) No person shall drive any vehicle on any of the lengths of road specified in the First Schedule to this notice. Exceptions will be made for:
    - (i) vehicles in connection with the maintenance of roads and the supply of gas, electricity and water; (ii) fire engines, ambulances or police vehicles;
    - (iii) public service vehicles; (iv) access in certain circumstances,
  - ) No person shall cause any vehicle proceeding in St. George's Road, Montpellier Walk or the Promenade *(b)* respectively to make a right-hand turn into Montpellier Street, Montpellier Spa Road or Queen's Circus respectively.
  - (c) No person shall cause any vehicle to proceed in that length of Grosvenor Place South in the Borough which extends from its junction with High Street for
  - a distance of 165 feet in a north-easterly direction.
    (d) No person shall cause any vehicle to proceed in the roads or lengths of road specified in Column 1 of the Second Schedule to this notice in a direction other than that specified in relation to that road or length of road as the case may be in Column 2 of the said Schedule.
  - (e) During the period of the experiment certain disc park-ing places will be suspended from operation in parts of the following streets:

Bath Street, Bath Road, Clarence Parade, Cambray Place, Clarence Street, Grosvenor Street, Imperial Square, Oriel Road, Royal Well Place, Henrietta Street, Pittville Street, Regent Street, Royal Well Road, Wellington Street and Winchcomb Street.

(f) In Ambrose Street the existing on-street parking place will be suspended, and replaced on the northwest side of the road.
