

## PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AND CLEAN AIR ACT

### CHESTERFIELD BOROUGH COUNCIL

#### CLEAN AIR ACT 1956

##### *The Chesterfield No. 9 (St. Thomas) Smoke Control Order 1974*

Notice is hereby given that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Chesterfield in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act, on the 5th February 1974, made an Order entitled "The Borough of Chesterfield No. 9 (St. Thomas) Smoke Control Order 1974" declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 1st September 1975, or 12 months from the date of confirmation by the Secretary of State for the Environment, whichever is the later.

The Order provides

- (i) That fireplaces in buildings or parts of buildings separately occupied without a gas supply be exempt from the provisions of the said section 11 on condition that only authorised fuels as declared by Regulations under the Clean Air Act 1956, and kindling sticks and paper for the purposes of lighting fires shall be used in the fireplaces.
- (ii) That fireplaces in buildings or in parts of buildings which have a gas supply but in which the cost of providing gas ignition would exceed £16 be exempt from the provisions of the said section 11 on condition that only authorised fuels as declared by Regulations under the Clean Air Act 1956, and kindling sticks and paper for the purposes of lighting fires shall be used in the fireplaces.
- (iii) That the following premises be exempted from the requirements of the Order—

252-258 Old Road  
1-5 Stoppard Row  
402-406 Chatsworth Road  
8-10 Old Hall Road  
14-20 Old Hall Road  
112-116 Old Road  
126 Old Road  
4-8 Victoria Street West

- (iv) That the following premises be exempted from the Order for a maximum period of 3 years from the date of operation

22-44 Churston Road  
47-53 Churston Road  
1-29 Manor Drive  
2-22 Manor Drive  
1-11 Manor Crescent  
2-18 Manor Crescent

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Clerk's Office, Chesterfield, at all reasonable times during the period of 6 weeks from the 5th April 1974.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may, by notice in writing to the Secretary of State, Department of the Environment, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

#### SCHEDULE

That area of land bounded by the centre line of Ashgate Road from its junction with Loundsley Green Road and the Borough boundary, to its junction with Old Hall Road; the centre line of Old Hall Road to its junction with Walton Road; the centre line of Walton Road to its

junction with Whitecotes Lane and thence by the western boundary of the Borough to its junction with Loundsley Green Road and Ashgate Road.

### HOYLAND NETHER URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

#### CLEAN AIR ACT 1956

##### *The Hoyland Nether No. 4 Smoke Control Order 1974*

Notice is hereby given that the Hoyland Nether Urban District Council, in exercise of powers conferred upon them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act, on the 31st January 1974 made an Order entitled the "Hoyland Nether No. 4 Smoke Control Order 1974", declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the said Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of fuels other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 1st September 1975, or such later date determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

Copies of the Order and the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Clerk's Department, Town Hall, Hoyland, near Barnsley in normal office hours during the period of six weeks from the 29th day of March 1974.

Within the said period, any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary, Department of the Environment, Queen Anne's Chambers, Tothill Street, London SW1 H9JY, object to the confirmation of the Order.

#### SCHEDULE

That continuous area of land bounded on the north or north-west by the centre line of Hoyland Road from its junction with Sheffield Road to its junction with West Street/Hawshaw Lane and continuing by the centre line of Hawshaw Lane from the last mentioned junction to its junction with Kirk Balk; on the east or north-east by the centre line of Kirk Balk from its junction with Hawshaw Lane to its junction with West Street (at the War Memorial); on the south or south-east by the centre line of West Street from the last mentioned junction to the junction with Skiers View Road and continuing by the centre line of Skiers View Road to its junction with Stead Lane; then continuing by the centre line of Stead Lane through to its junction with Broadcarr Road and by the centre line of Broadcarr Road to the point of the Urban District boundary on that highway; and on the west or south-west by a line running along the said boundary from Broadcarr Road to the centre line of Sheffield Road and continuing along the centre line of Sheffield Road to its junction with Hoyland Road.
