CLEAN AIR ACT 1956

The Borough of Widnes (No. 15) Smoke Control Order 1974

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of Widnes in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on the 11th day of January 1974 made an Order entitled "Borough of Widnes (No. 15) Smoke Control Order 1974" declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area, which is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State to the Environment for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the Smoke Control Area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20, unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuel and electricity.

If confirmed, the Order will not come into operation before the 1st October 1974, or before a later date determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Clerk's Office, Municipal Buildings, Kingsway, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 29th March 1974.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary of State, Department of the Environment, 2 Marsham Street, London, SW1P 3EB, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

The area comprises 27.6 acres or thereabouts.

The boundary commences at a point at the junction of St. Michaels Road and Hale Road. The line then runs south-easterly along St. Michaels Road to the point where it is crossed by the Widnes/Speke Road then in a westerly direction along the line of Widnes/Speke Road to the point where it is crossed by Hale Road, then in a northerly direction along Hale Road to the point of commencement.

£0.85 for each subsequent minute (or part thereof).

1. The Post Office hereby gives notice that as from 1 April 1974 the charges for telephone calls (except Datal calls and calls from call offices and coin box lines) from places within the United Kingdom and the Isle of Man to India and Nigeria will be as shown in columns 2 and 3 of Schedule 1 to this Notice: the charges for the personal call facility in relation to such calls will be as shown in column 4 of the said Schedule 1. These charges have been fixed by the Post Office in accordance with paragraphs 25(1) and 30(3) of the Post Office Telephone Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme T3/1972) as amended and may be revised by the Post Office without notice.

2. The Post Office hereby further gives notice that as from 1 April 1974 the charges for transferred charge calls made from India when the person answering a called telephone in the United Kingdom or the Isle of Man consents to the call charges being reversed will be as shown in columns 5 and 6 of Schedule 1 to this Notice. These charges have been fixed by the Post Office in accordance with paragraph 36(3)(a) of the Post Office Telephone Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme T3/1972) as amended and may be revised by the Post Office without notice.

3. The Post Office hereby further gives notice that as from 1 April 1974 the charges for credit card calls made from telephones on the telephone systems of Authorities providing service in India and Nigeria to any telephone in the United Kingdom and the Isle of Man will be as shown in columns 7, 8 and 9 of Schedule 1 to this Notice. These charges have been fixed by the Post Office in accordance with paragraph 37(6)(b) of the Post Office Telephone Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme T3/1972) as amended and may be revised by the Post Office without notice.

4. The Post Office hereby further gives notice that as from 1 April 1974 the charges to callers for telephone calls made from call offices and coin-box lines having a coin collecting box which accepts 2p and 10p coins, from places within the United Kingdom and the Isle of Man to India and Nigeria will be as shown in columns 2 and 3 of Schedule 2 to this Notice; the charge for the personal call facility in relation to such calls will be as shown in column 4 of the said Schedule 2. These charges have been fixed by the Post Office in accordance with paragraph 25(1) of the Post Office Telephone Scheme 1972 (Post Office Scheme T3/1972) as amended and may be revised by the Post Office without notice.
