# **ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS**

## ANGLESEY COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Anglesey (Various Roads, Rhosneigr) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1974

Notice is hereby given that on 10th January 1974 the Anglesey County Council made the above-named Order under section 1(1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968 The effect of the Order is to prohibit with certain exceptions:

1. The waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. in the following lengths of road:

Lengths of roads in Rhosneigr in the Rural District of Valley in the County of Anglesey
