The Bedford Rural District (Renhold Footpaths Nos. 4 and 5) (Part) Public Path Diversion Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that on the 23rd March 1974 the Bedford Rural District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert:

- (1) Part of the footpath running from The Polhill Arms to Church Cottages, Renhold, being that portion which crosses Field Ordnance Nos. 145 and 144 in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 443 yards, to a line running northwards along the western boundary of Field Ordnance No. 145 for a distance of approximately 193 yards and then eastwards along the northern boundary of such field for a distance of approximately 350 yards to exit on to highway C44 at the north-eastern corner of such field.
- (2) Part of the footpath running from Church Cottages, Renhold to Bridleway No. 13 Renhold, being that portion running from the northern boundary of Field Ordnance No. 74 generally in a south-easterly direction across Fields Ordnance Nos. 74, 73 and 187 into Field Ordnance No. 188 to Bridleway 13, a distance of 918 yards, to a line running from highway C44 at the north-eastern corner of Field Ordnance No. 145 along the eastern boundaries of Fields Ordnance Nos. 145 and 180 into Field Ordnance No. 181, a distance of approximately 703 yards, to join Bridleway No. 26 at the south-western corner of Bushy Close Spinney.

The Bedford Rural District (Riseley Footpaths Nos. A.4 and A.5) (Part) Public Path Diversion Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that on the 23rd March 1974 the Bedford Rural District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert part of Footpath No. A.4 running from Riseley Church to the drive leading to Sackville Lodge, being that portion which crosses Field Ordnance No. 109 for a distance of approximately 35 yards and part of Footpath No. A.5

running from Footpath No. A.7 to Footpath No. 24, being that portion which crosses Field Ordnance No. 109 for a distance of approximately 40 yards to:

- (1) A line running across Field Ordnance No. 109 north-westerly for a distance of approximately 55 yards then north-easterly for a distance of approximately 32 yards where it joins Footpath No. A.5 and
- (2) A line running across Field Ordnance No. 109 north-easterly for a distance of approximately 37 yards to the north-eastern boundary of such field then approximately 30 yards along such boundary during which it rejoins Footpath No. A.4 and then approximately 13 yards south-westerly where it rejoins Footpath No. A.5.
