Notice is hereby given that the Hereford City Council have made an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, to come into effect on the 29th March 1974. The effect of the Order will be to restrict waiting in that length of Grandstand Road which is a lay-by adjacent to Numbers 72 and 72A Grandstand Road to a period not longer than 20 minutes (return being prohibited for 40 minutes).

A copy of the Order and a map showing the length of road to which the Order relates, together with a statement of the Council's reasons for making the Order, may be inspected at the offices of the undersigned during normal office hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of this Order on the grounds that it is not within the powers of section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the said Act, as amended, or that any requirement of that section or that any regulation made under section 84C (1) of the said Act, as amended, has not been complied with may within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made make an application for that purpose to the High Court.

HOVE BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Hove (Parking Places and Traffic Regulation) Order 1974

Notice is hereby given that the Hove Borough Council (hereinafter called "tht Council") on the 21st March 1974 made the above-named Order under sections 1 (1), (2), (3) 28 (1), 31 (1), 35, 36, 37, 39 and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968. The general effect of this Order which will experience the section of the 1501 to 1000 to 10000 to 1000 to 10000 to 1000 to 10000 to 1000 to 10000 to 1000 to which will come into operation on the 15th July 1974 is:

- 1. to designate parking places, for which charges may be made in the streets, or parts of streets, against which the No. (1) appears in Schedule 1 hereto, to provide for the issue of a permit for one vehicle, being either a passenger vehicle or a goods vehicle, belonging to any resident of Hove whose usual place of abode is at premises in any of the said streets, or parts of streets, on payment of the prescribed charge, and to authorise the use of such parking places for the parking, without limitation of time, of a vehicle displaying a valid permit in respect of that vehicle;
- clisplaying a valid permit in respect of that vehicle;
 2. to authorise street parking places, without charges, in those streets, or parts of streets, against which the number (2) and/or (3) appears in Schedule 1 hereto for use by passenger vehicles and goods vehicles only, for the following maximum waiting period between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays, inclusive, any such day not being Christmas Day, Good Friday or a Bank Holiday, being a public holiday, but otherwise without limitation of time:
 In the case of the streets or parts of streets against

In the case of the streets or parts of streets against which the number (2) appears in the said schedule for a maximum waiting period of two hours and in the case of the streets or parts of streets against which the number (3) appears for a maximum waiting period of five hours. When a vehicle has left a parking place after waiting therein it is not, within sixty minutes after leaving permitted to wait again within that parking place ;

3. to regulate the use of the parking places mentioned in 1 and 2 above and in particular:

in 1 and 2 above and in particular:
(i) to provide minimum part or parts of parking places in which vehicles may not be left;
(ii) to provide minimum part or parts of parking places for use for loading or unloading for no more than thirty minutes or for such longer period as a police constable in uniform or a traffic warden may without and the second authorise ;

4. to authorise street parking places, without charges for use by motor cycles only on any day and without limitation of time in those streets or parts of streets against which the number 4 appears in Schedule 1 hereto;

- 5. to authorise street parking places, without charges, for the use by hackney carriages, disabled persons vehicles and police vehicles on any day and without limitation of time in those streets, or parts of streets, against which the numbers (5), (6) and (7) respectively appear in Schedule 1 hereto;
- 6. to prohibit waiting at all times in specified lengths of those streets, or parts of streets, against which the number (8) appears in the said Schedule ;
- 7. to prohibit waiting between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays, inclusive, any such day not being Christmas Day, Good Friday or a Bank Holiday, being a public holiday, in the lengths of those streets, or parts of streets, specified in the said Schedule which will not comprise part of a parking place or be subject to a prohibition of waiting at all times;
- 8. to make the streets and parts of streets specified in Column 1 of Schedule 2 to this Notice one-way streets and to require vehicles therein not to proceed otherwise than in the direction specified in Column 2 of the said Schedule opposite each such street or part of a street ;
- 9. to authorise a charge of £5 for a permit for a period of 12 calendar months and to provide for an appropriate Order whereby the permit is surrendered, withdrawn or otherwise rendered invalid before its expiry;

10. to authorise the following exemptions to the provision of the proposed Order:

of the proposed Order: (i) any passenger vehicle or goods vehicle may wait in any designated parking place referred to in 1 above, without a permit for a maximum period of 2 hours between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays, inclusive, any such day not being Christmas Day, Good Friday or a Bank Holiday, being a public holiday, but otherwise without limitation of time. Provided that when a vehicle has left a parking place after waiting therein it is not within sixty minutes after leaving permitted to wait again within that parking place;

(ii) any disabled persons' vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge may wait in any designated parking place referred to in 1 above, without a permit, and in any street parking place referred to in 2 above, and in any length of street referred to in 7 above, in each case without limitation of time; and

(iii) any vehicle may wait in any of the said designated parking places unless suspended without a permit, and in any of the street parking places referred to in 2 and 3 above, and in any length of street referred to in 4 and 5 above, at any time when the vehicle is waiting to enable any person to board or alight, being used for public utility, Post Office, fire brigade, police, ambulance or local authority purposes, or for window or chimney cleaning, bill posting, street works, furniture removal or the collection or delivery of goods or merchandise ;

- 11. to authorise the following provisions of the proposed Order: its commencement, citation and interpretation, the revocation of certain provisions of subsisting Orders of the Council, the application for, form of, issue, display, surrender, withdrawal and validity of permits, and duplicate permits, the placing of traffic signs, the manner of standing, waiting and use of vehicles in parking places, the movement in or removal of vehicles from parking places in emergencies, the suspension of the use of parking places and the restriction of the use of vehicles in parking places;
- 12. Full details of the Order and a map showing the streets or parts of streets and the provisions referred to in this Notice may be inspected at the under-mentioned address between the hours of 8.45 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 2.15 p.m. to 5.30 p.m. on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays, and 8.45 a.m. to 1 p.m. and 2.15 p.m. to 5 p.m. on Fridays.
- 13. If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulations, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order you may within 6 weeks from the 21st March 1974 apply to the High Court for this purpose.
