

- (b) Chocolates, sweets, similar confectionery and chocolate biscuits ;
- (c) Manufactured non-alcoholic beverages, including fruit juices and bottled waters, and products for the preparation of beverages ; and cider, perry, etc., not specifically chargeable with customs or excise duty ;
- (d) Potato crisps and similar products, salted and roasted nuts.

The Order also imposes value added tax at the standard rate on all hydro-carbon oils on which revenue duty at the unrebated rate (at present 22½p per gallon), has been or is to be charged, on any gas to be used as road fuel, on petrol substitutes and on power methylated spirits.

The Order came into operation on 1st April 1974 and has been published as Statutory Instrument 1974 No. 542.

MISUSE OF DRUGS ACT 1971—SECTION 12 (2)

Direction prohibiting exercise of Powers in relation to controlled drugs

Savile Moller

In accordance with section 12 (2) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State gave the following direction which was served and thereby came into effect on 3rd April 1974:

Whereas Savile Moller, M.R.C.S., L.R.C.P., whose registered address is 92 Bingley Road, Shipley, Yorkshire, is a doctor who has been convicted of offences under the Dangerous Drugs Act 1965:

Now therefore in pursuance of section 12 (2) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971, I, the Rt. Hon. Roy Jenkins, one of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, by this direction prohibit the said Savile Moller from having in his possession, prescribing, administering, manufacturing, compounding and supplying and from authorising the administration and supply of the substances and products for the time being specified in Part I of Schedule 2 to that Act.
