THE IMPORTED FOOD REGULATIONS 1968/1973

Belgium: Official Certificate

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food gives notice that in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Imported Food Regulations 1968/1973 he hereby recognises the Official Certificate of the design shown in the First Schedule hereto for the importation from Belgium of poultry meat as showing

(i) that the poultry meat to which it relates was derived from poultry inspected before and after death in the country of origin of the poultry meat and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Minister; and

(ii) that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the poultry meat was carried out with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.

Recognition of the Official Certificate is restricted to the extent shown in the Second Schedule.
