Cheffer, April 20.

N Monday laft; his Excellency the Lord John Berkley, His Majeftics Lieutenant and Generel Governour of Ireland artived here with a great Train, attended also into Town by most Gentlemen of the Countrey who met him in the way: a this entry the Great Guns from the Gaftle were discharged; the Mayor, Aldermen, and Common Council of the 6 ity in their formalities, receiving his Excellency at the Gates of the City, and afterwards at his Lodging, paying the respects due to his Merits, and eminent employment.

Yesterday in the forenoon his Excellency went hences and at five in the afternoon embarked at Dampool, where the Monmouth and Mary Yacht attended for his transportation, the winds being favourab e to his passage, he is supposed to be fafely arrived at Dublin.

Suppoled to be fately artived at Dublin. Copenhagen. April Yo. On Wedneiday before Eafter the body of the decealed King was folemnly removed inro the Church of the Caftle, which was hung with mourning, and placed upon at bed of State, supported by four Pillars, and covered with black Velvet; about it are placed three Lyons of filver, bigger then the life, and over it the Diadem, an Angell, and 18 Standards with the Arms of fo many Provinces under the jurifdiction of this Crown, and about it many Tapers in large Candlefticks. The body is to continue there till the folemn Funeral, which will be performed with extraordinary folemnity and Magnificence.

Rome, April 15. All the week before Eafter was spent here in the usual Devotions appointed for the kason, where extraordinary Prayers and Processions were used by the Secular as well as Regular Clergy, for a bleffing upon the future Election.

On Thursday last Cardinal Branesceio seemed to have s great interest in the Conclave, and it was generally believed both in the City and Conclave that he might have succeeded in the Papacy; but the Spanish faction remembring that his promotion to his Dignity of Cardinal sprang from the Barbarini, for his over zealous affertion of the Ecclessifical interest against the pretensions of his Catholick Majesty, not only withdrew their suffrages, but wholly excluded him to his no small mortification.

Yefferday the French Ambaffador had an Audience from the Conclave, as had likewife the Venetian Ambaffador, the latter in a long (peech directed to the heads of the feveral Orders, fetting before them the many ill confequenees of this long vacancy in the Pontifical Chair, and the dangerous Commotion in Hungary, on which he long infifted, thewing them how neceffary it was for them to lay afide all private interest and proceed heartily and unanimoufly to the election of a fit petion to govern in the Church.

Cardinal & Elsi, formerly excluded by the French, continues under a great indifposition, with little hopes of recovery, and Cardinal Aquaviva is dangerously ill.

From the frontiers of the Ecclesiastical State upon the River Tronto, we have frequent advice of many incursions, firings and plunderings committed by the Banditi 5 whereupon the Golledge have given Orders to the Officers of the forces in the Province of Marcha, to draw thitherwards from Ancona some of the Companies lately seturned from Dalmatig. From Naples they are full of complaints of the infalency of thole Banditi in leveral parts upon the borders of that kingdom; and that fome days fince they armed out four Feluccas, and fell upon two which were on the way from Sicily, bound for Naples, which they feized with Chevalier Zancred a Knight of Maltha, and a confiderable booty of Plate. The Receiver of the Qrder of the Knights of Maltha, by leave from the Viceroy is upon Treaty with them for the redemption of this Knight, for which they have the confidence to demand no lets then 50 thouland Crowns.

The three Sicilian Gallies fince they were laft put back again into Naples by ill weather, are again put to fea on their return for Sicily.

The Viceroy continues his care for the fecurity of all places within his Government 3 he lately fent feveral Spanish Companies to Reggio, and is now ordering three other Companies of Spanish Foot to march away by Land to Ottrante.

Legorn, April 15. The roth inflant fayled hence the Mary for Naples and Scanderoon; Yefterday arrived here 3 Gallyes of Genoua, having on board them a New Governour for the Ifland of Corfica.

Three of the Grand Dukes Gallyes are abroad in Corfa, under the Command of the Chevalier R facoli.

From Maltha we have notice of the arrival there of 4 Christian Privateers, 2. of Maltha, and 2. of this place, who have brought in with them 5 Prizes taken from the Turks, all of them Ships on which were Embarked Souldiers to be transported from Allexandria to Constantion nople.

Madrid, April 16. On Saturday last the Duke de Villa Hermofa went hence for St Sebastian. intending there to embark himfelf for Flanders, to enter upon the possession of his Charge as General of the Cavalry in the Metherlands.

The Constable of Castille solutions by his friends in this Sourt to be called home from his Government of the Netherlands, but as yet his successfor is not appointed. The said some new propositions have been made to Don Iuan, offring him that Government, which if he refuse, may be conferred either on Charles Prince of Lorrain, or the Duke de Veraguas our Admiral.

Genoua, April 18. The Briftol artiving here with an Extraordinary Gargo from Cadiz, fayled hence the 12th inflant for Legorn.

The laft week arrived here incognize from Final the Duke d' Offuna, defigned Governour of the Dutchy of Milan, fo foon as the Senate had notice of his arrival, they fent 4 Gentlemen to attend and Compliment him in their name. The 16 inftant he returned again to Final, where he intends to expend a confiderable fem of moneys, to build a Mole to fecure the Port, that Marchants may, be encouraged to Eltablish a Trade there.

The 13th inftant arrived here the Cardinal Porto Carers from Spain on his way for Rome, and yesterday Embarqued upon one of the States Galleys which is Order red to transport him to *Givita Vecchia*.

From Milan. we are advised, that the Companies of the Guards are all-of them marched towards the Frontiers to attend the new Governour; and that the Opputes of the City of Milan with these from the other Cities and Provinces depending upon that Government, are preparing to go and Compliment the new Governour, whethas them word not to give themselves
