THE IMPORTED FOOD REGULATIONS 1968 AS AMENDED

South Africa: Official Certificate

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Imported Food Regulations 1968 (S.I. 1968 No. 97) as amended by the Imported Food (Amendment) Regulations 1973 (S.I. 1973 No. 1351) hereby restricts recognition of the Official Certificates reproduced in the Schedule to the notice published in the London Gazette dated 9th January 1962, for the importation of meat and meat products from South Africa, to the extent shown in the Schedule hereto.

The notice published in the London Gazette dated 17th May 1973, is hereby revoked.

Uruguay: Official Certificate

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food gives notice that in exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Imported Food Regulations 1968 (S.I. 1968, No. 97) the Imported Food Regulations 1968 (S.I. 1968, No. 97) as amended by the Imported Food (Amended) Regulations 1973 (S.I. 1973, No. 1351) he hereby recognises for the purpose of the importation from Uruguay of recognisable cuts of boneless beef which have attached to them the associated lymphatic nodes the Official Certificate of the design shown in Part I of the Schedule hereto as showing (i) that the beef was derived from bovines inspected before and after death at a United Kingdom approved establishment and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Minister and (ii) that the dressing packing and other the Minister, and (ii) that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the beef was carried out with all the necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.

Where the certificate is in the form of a label the recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the beef or the package containing the beef and if the beef or the package containing the beef and if the label has not in any circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate; and where the Official Certificate is in the form of a stamp, the recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed or otherwise marked on the beef and the package containing the beef:

Recognition of the Official Certificate is restricted to those completed by the insertion of one of the establishment

numbers currently approved by the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food.
