St. James's, January 1. The humble Address of the ord-Lieutenant, Deputy-Lieutenants, Justices of the feace Clergy, Gentlemen, and Frecholders of the County of Rutland; was presented to her Majesty by the Right Honourable the Lord Sherard, Lord-Lieutenant of the faid County.

Which Address Her Majesty received very graciously.

Hague, Fanuary 10. N. S. Monssieur van Stocken hath given in his Gredentials to the States-General, and is to refide here as his Danith Majesty's Secretary, until ano her Minister be sent hither from Copenhagen. Count Lecheraine set out from hence on the 28th of the last Month, in order to return to Duffeldorp; and Monfieur Stadian, the Chief Minister of the Elector of Mayence, arrived here on the 30 h. Monsieur Duyvenvoorden hath been elected by the States-General to fucceed the late Earl of Portland in the Government of the City and Barony of Breda. The Earl of Stairs arrived here on the fecond Instant from Great Britain; and yesterday proceeded on his Journey to the Court of King Augustus. Next Week the States of Holland and Westfriezland are to reassemble, in order to concert such Measures as are surther necessary for a vigorous and early Campaign. Yesterday Count Zinzend of and Baron Heems, the Imperial Ministers, the Lord Townshend, her Britannick Majefly's Pleniporentiary, Count Maffei, the Marquis de la Borgue, and the Marquis de Mellarede, Ministers from the Duke of Savoy, had a long Conference with the Deputies of the States-General; and we hear that they have renewed the Posterior ed the Treaty with Baron Bothmar, the Minister of the El ctor of Hanover, concerning the Troops belonging to his Electoral Highness that are in the Service of the Quean of Great Britain and the States General. Monthat Maturof, the Russian and the States General. Millian Maturof, the Russian Ambassador, and Baron Gerstors, Envoy from King Augustus to this Republick, have delivered Memorials to the States-General concerning the profess posture of the Affairs of their respective Matters. We are advised from Flanders, that the Enemy are con-We are advised from Flanders, that the Enemy are con-tinuity employed in casting up Entrenchments, and addieg new Fortifications to their Frontier Towns, that the Pronters who were at work on the new Lines near Mau-

beuge, are fent to Marpain, Bouffiere, Thuin, and other Towns structed along the Sambre, where they are to build Redoubts for the Defence of that Frontier; and that feveral Regiments of the Troops quartered in France were in motion towards the Low-Countries, in order to makeroom for thosethat are expected from Spain. These Advices add, that the French Court had feut an Ordinance to all the Intendants of the Frontiers, to put in Execution the Confication of all the Goods and Revenues that any of the Allies have in France; and of all those who refide in any Places under the Juridiction of the French King; which Ordinance is to be Printed, and dispersed to every Town and Village in their respective Governments, with particular Infructions to all the Magistrates and Officers of the Civil Lift, to take an exact Account of all fuch Goods and Revenues, and foreturn the fame to the Intencants within 15 Days, under the Penalty of paying 500 Florins, in case of Disobedience. We are also advised, that the Inhabitants of Doway had raken up Arms against the Magistrates, because they would have obliged them to raise 400 Florins for each liattalion in the Garrison of that Place. Advices from Namur say, that Preparations were making in that City for the reception of the Duke of Bavaria, whose arrival was expected from Valenciennes on the 15th or 16th Inflant, that a great many Miners, and others belonging to the Artillery in the Service of the Duke of Anjou, had Orders to March into Spain, where they are to serve the ensuing Campaign, with a Promise that all their Arrears shall be forthwith paid them, the Expences of their March discharged, and that several Months pay shall be advanced to them as a further Gratuity; and that the Marquis de Leede and the Baron de Capres, both Lieutenants-General, had also been commanded by the Duke of Anjou to repair immediately into Spain. Letters from Brussels say, that Orders had been fent to several Magistrates of the Neighbouring Towns and Villages, to give in an exact Account of all the Horfes that are to be found within the Jurisdiction of that City. These Letters add, that the Alies were filling the Magazines of the Frontier Towns with stores of Provision and Ammunicion, that their Troops might be enabled to take the Field very early this enfuing spring. Advices from France import, that the French King returned on the 21st of the last Month from Marli to Verfailles; the next Day his Majefly vificed the Marthal Villars, and continued in Conference with him two hours. On the 27th a general Council of War was held in the King's Privy Chamber, at which all the Princes of the Blood, all the Marshals and Generals assisted. These Advices add, that Marshal Boufflers had orders to fet out for Valenciennes about the middle of January, from whence he is to proceed to visic all the Posts on the Frontiers, and transmit an account of their condition to the King. We are further advised, that the Duke of Bavaria is appointed to Command in chief the enfuing Campaign in Flanders, and that the Duke of Vendome and Marshal Boufflers are to serve uncer him; that the Duke of Berwick and Martha. D'Harcourr are to Command on the Upper Rhine; and that the King had given Orders to all the Officers to have their Troops compleat before the 8th of the next Month. Letters from spain advise, that the Doke of Anjou finding it impossible to fettle the necessary Funds for the regular Payment of his Troops, had published an Order, that for the present Subfished of those in Arragon, they were to receive part of their Pay in Provisions from the Neighbouring Towns; and all parts of Arragon are to be affect. ed with this Order in proportion to their Riches, and

These Advices add, that of the French Troops which lately evacuated Spain, there were left behind to the number of five thousand, as Deferters or fick Men, and that five compleat Battalions have already been formed of such as remained in Spain under fuch Pretences: That the Duke of Anjou is builed in building new Fortifications at Tortofa, being apprehensive that the Allies, who have assembled a considerable Body of Troops in the Plains of Terragons, have formed a delign upon that Place. That Prince hath lately made a Promotion of twenty four General Officers, twelve of whom are Lieutenants-General, and twelve Majors-General; and hath also conferred the Honour of Grandee of Spain on Count Ma-We hear by the fame Advices, that three cida de Gatia. Battalions which layin Rouffillon are arrived in Spain, in order to join the Spanish Forces in Arragon. Six'y Officers are commanded out of the French Troops in Flanders, who are to be disposed of in the Troops of the Duke of Anjau. The Marquis de Bay having lately been at Madrid from Estremadura, to give an Account of the Posture of Affairs in those Parts, after several Conferences concerning the Dispositions which are to be made for the Service of the next Campaign, had an Offer made him to Command either on the Frontiers of Arragon or Portugal; He chose the latter, and immediately returned to Badajos. It was faid that Count Staremberg feemed to have a Defign on Fraga and Moncon, that by taking in those Places he may be able to cut off the Enemies Communication with Lerida, and open a Passage into Arragon; and there are Letters which fay the Allies are already Mafters of Moncon. We hear from Leiplic, that King Augustus arrived there from Dresden the latter end of the last Month, attended by a numerous Court; that the Durchess of Wolfemburrel and the Princefsher Daughter, accompanied by the Prince of Saxony, were expected there on the first or second of this Month; and the King of Pruffia, the Prince-Royal the Margrave Albert, and the Duke of Courland on the firth. The Hereditary Prince of Muscovy had passed Breslau, in order to come to the same Place; and it was reported, that the Elector of Hanover intended to be also at this Interview. The Marquis de Bonac, the late Minister of France to King Stanislaus, is still at Leipfic, and intends to fray 'till after the Fair of that Place, and hath already obtained Passports from the King of Prussia, the King of Poland and his Electoral Highness of Hanover, in order to return into France through their Dominions.
