PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER

THE HIGHWAYS ACT 1959

The Powys County Council Public Path (Diversion) (No. 1) Order, 1974

Notice is hereby given that on the 3rd October 1974, the Powys County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert the public rights of way at Cwm Gwdi in the Communities of St. David Without and Cantref described in the first part of the attached Schedule to the position described in the second part of the Schedule.

A copy of the Order, as confirmed, and the map contained in it, has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at:

The Order becomes operative as from the 17th October 1974, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirements of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder had not been complied with in relation to the Order, he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within six weeks from the 3rd day of October make an application for the purpose to the High Court.

Part 1

(a) Footpath No. 2 on the Cwm Gwdi Rifle Range in the Community of St. David Without shown on O.S. Breconshire Sheets XXXIII north-east and south-west.

(b) That part of Footpath No. 17 on the Cwm Gwdi Rifle Range in the Communities of St. David Without and Cantref shown as aforesaid from the southern junction with Footpath No. 2 running in a south-westerly direction for a length of 170 yards to the point marked "A" on the attached map.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on the 16th July 1974, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Purbeck District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the public right of way running from the eastern end of Houns-tout Cliff, Encombe, Corfe Castle, through fields of Encombe and Westhill Farms to a point at the western end of Houns-tout Cliff to a line running from the eastern end to the western end of Houns-tout Cliff directly along the cliff top.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at Westport House, Wareham, Dorset, between 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

Purbeck District (Corfe Castle FP.43B) Public Path Diversion Order 1974

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on the 16th July 1974, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Purbeck District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the public right of way running from Freshwater Steps, Encombe, Corfe Castle north and westerly through fields of Encombe Farm to rejoin the cliff top above Kimmeridge Ledges to a line running from Freshwater Steps directly along the cliff top in a westerly direction to rejoin the original path above Kimmeridge Ledges.
