

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 16th day of October 1974.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas the Secretary of State for the Environment, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of Newburn, in the City of Newcastle upon Tyne, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act 1853 as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in St. Michael and All Angels' Churchyard (North Side), in the said Parish, shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

Provided that in any earthen grave now existing in the said portion of the Churchyard, the burial may be allowed

of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave, and that no burial shall take place within six feet of the boundary walls of the said Churchyard.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 19th day of December next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 19th day of December.
