**LONDON BOROUGH OF CAMDEN**

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Camden, in pursuance of section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, has determined that the area known as Camden Square, as delineated on the relevant map No. 10301A, is of special architectural or historic character or appearance which it is desirable to preserve or enhance and has designated such area as a "conservation area" for the purposes of the section.

No building or part of a building, with certain minor exceptions, within the above-scheduled conservation area can be demolished without the prior approval of the Council given as the result of a "listed building application".

Furthermore, anyone proposing to cut down, top, lop, uproot, wilfully damage or wilfully destroy any tree not covered by a Tree Preservation Order within the area, must give 6 weeks notice of such intention to the Council, addressed to the undersigned, within which time the Council may make a preservation Order.

Generally, the Council will look particularly carefully at all applications involving development or demolition within

the area. Consideration will be given to the probable effect of any proposal upon the character or appearance of the area or the setting of a listed building. The Council is required to publish notice of the receipt of such applications to enable interested parties to submit observations.

**NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER**

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971—SECTION 210  
*Dacorum District Council Footpath No. 51 (Breakspear Way to Woodwells Lane) Public Path Diversion Order*

Notice is hereby given that on the 2nd July 1974 the Dacorum District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way that part of public footpath No. 51 as extends from a point approximately 37 yards north of Breakspear Way stile in a north-easterly direction for 175 yards as an undefined path across grassland to its junction with Woodwells Farm Road at a point 200 yards north of its junction with Breakspear Way to a line commencing at a point on existing footpath No. 51 approximately 37 yards from Breakspear Way stile and continuing at a width of 6 feet along the east side of a hedge in a northerly direction for 127 yards to its junction with footpath No. 50 at a point 153 yards west of the point where footpath No. 50 joins Woodwells Farm Road.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Town Hall, Marlowes, Hemel Hempstead, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Thursdays inclusive and between 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Fridays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 1st day of December 1974, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 within 6 weeks from the date of this notice make an application for the purpose to the High Court.
