NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER HIGHWAYS ACT 1959

The County Council of Essex (Footpath 41 Fyfield) Public Path Diversion Order 1974

Notice is hereby given that on 12th June 1974 the Essex County Council confirmed the above-named Order. The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way (being footpath 41, Fyfield) running from a point about 150 feet east of the junction of Willingale Road and road B.184 from Fyfield to Abbess Roding for approximately 290 feet in a south-easterly direction through O.S. field 327 to the River Roding and footpath 27, to a line starting from a point in Willingale Road about 430 feet east of its junction with road B.184 running in a generally south-easterly and southerly direction for approximately 180 feet across O.S. field 327 and across the River Roding to join footpath 27.

A copy of the confirmed Order, and the map contained in it, has been deposited at the office of the Chief Executive and Clerk of the County Council, County Hall, Chelmsford, and at the offices of the Epping Forest District Council, 323 High Street, Epping, and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

HIGHWAYS ACT 1971

The County Council of Mid Glamorgan (Laleston to Treforest Classified Road) (Side Roads) Order 1974

The County Council of Mid Glamorgan hereby give notice that they have made and submitted to the Secretary of State for Wales for confirmation an Order under sections 1, 3 and 62 of the Highways Act 1971, and all other enabling powers authorising the Council:

- To improve sections of (a) South Road, (b) David Street, (c) Coity Road, (d) East Street and (e) Waterton Lane, all at Bridgend in the County of Mid Glamorgan;
- To stop up lengths of (a) Queens Street, (b) David Street, (c) Waterton Lane, (d) Waterton Road, (e) Coychurch to Treoes Road and (f) the road connecting Waterton Road with the classified road A.473 at Bridgend;
- To stop up the existing private means of access (i) from the Classified Road A.473 leading to the premises known as (a) Costains Concrete Products Limited (b) the Adult Training Centre, (c) the South Wales Police Authority's Parade Ground, Recreation Ground and Police Houses, (d) the British Road Services Depot, and (e) the "Gate Road" accesses to the Bridgend Industrial Estate, (ii) lengths of the access roads known as (a) Coity Crescent, (b) Kingsway and (c) East Street all on the Bridgend Industrial Estate, (iii) lengths of the

access roads to "Alliance Cash and Carry" and "Clarks Equipment Ltd." east of David Street and (iv) part of the access road to the Waterton Industrial Estate east of its junction with Waterton Lane.

- To construct new roads and new private means of access to take the place of those existing roads and private means of access referred to in paragraphs 2 and 3 above which are to be stopped up.
