Talmauth, April 20.

He 17 inftant came in here 2 fmall Brettons from Conquese Road in 6 days, but heard nothing of any Turks either upon the French or English Coafts.

The 18 arrived the Fortune of this place with Wine and Fruit from Malaga, having had from Cadiz the convenience of the great Convoy, amongst which were about 30 Sayl of English Merchant Ships, under the Protection of the Mary Rose, the rest Dutch and Hambourgers under the Conduct of an Hambourg and two Dutch men of War.

This day pafied before this Harbour, a Fleet of about 20 great mips, in poled to be the Dutch Squadron bound for the Streights.

Legorn, April 9. Here is lately put in the Swan of London of 8 Guns and 14 men, Koger Brown Captain, in 58 days from Ireland; in 30 from Alecant; 22 from Valença, and 4 from 52 Remo. The 24th of the laft month about 20 Leagues to the Weft of the Ifland of Corfica; an Argier Pirate of 24 Guis and 240 men came up and engaged him, and after marty flots paffed on both fides, boarded him with 60 men, of whom the Englifh in little time cleered themfelves, forcing them into the fea, fome of them faving themfelves in their boat, leaving only one Tutk a prifoner behind them, in little time the Argerine was out of fight, a little after feveral thirgs belonging to a fhip being feen floating on the water they fappofed the Argerine to thave funk, having received many dangerous fhots in the difpute.

The next day, another of their Pyrats came up, with whom the Swan exchanged fhot from mid-day till midnight, and then went off with French Colours: this Argerine carried 30 Guns, and as is confeft by the Turk who remained priloner, came out from Argier in company with the other about 40 days before. The Turk farther affirms, that the day before they had taken a Bark of Gensua laden with Gorn, but the men elcaped to land.

Vienna, April 13. The Turks have not declared themfelves abettors of the Count serini, but feem inclinable so protect him, talling him the General of the Christian Army: We have not any account of the fuccel's of our Army which has invested him in *Cackenthurn*, and are foppoled to have ere this, attempted the gaining of the place by a form.

Count Serini's fon, refußing to pals into Tutky as was defigned by the Count for an holtage, is lately arrived here, and endeavours to prevail with his Imperial Majefty for his Fathers parden : Father *Horffal*, the Counts Confefor being also returned hither upon the fame account.

The Count de Budiani has given the Emperor intelligence, that the Turks have drawn a g eat body of their forces together near Zigeth.

"The Emperor has given Order to Major G neral Pankan to leize on all the Poffeffions and Commands of the Count Serini, and to take from him all the means of raifing Moneys to recruit himfelf. The Effate of the Count de Tattenback is under fequestration, and filmfelf a prifoner in the Cittadel of Gratz: Every day difcovers perfons who were engaged with the Count in thefe diflurbances: the 1 th inftant the Count Efferhaft fent hicker Neubaufel, having about himfeveral Letters, which are fappoled to be of great concentration. The Jews are preparing in obedience to the Emperours Command, to leave this City before the time prefixt, but will not difcover where they intend to fettle themfelves.

Warfaw, April 14. On Wedneiday laft the Diet again met, and after many arguments and perfwalions were prevailed with to go to the Houle of the Senators to hear their opinions as to the leveral things propoled to them by his Majefty, but the next day fell again to their difputes and private differitions, which tis believed will conclude this Affembly, the time of their Seliton expiring within two days, and little hopes remaining that they can be brought by a general confent to prolong the Diet.

H. re are lately arrived feveral of the great Senators, the Bilhop of Gracow and Warmland, the Palatine of Pomerania and divers others, but the Archbillog of Gnefne Itill abients himfelf,

The 12th inftant one of the Deputies of the Affembly being at his Devotion in st John's Church in this City, obferved a paper lying upon the Altar, which his Curiofity, prompting him to look into ; he found that the Author being troubled in conficience at a configiracy, into which he had been drawn for the depoling of the King from his Authority, had thought fit this way to offer at the difference of it, offering to prove it and difficie all the confpirators, in cafe the Republick would give him caution and fecurity that he fhould be preferved harmlefs from all reproach and danger ; farther differences of maintaining their liberty under which they were to hide their confpiracy.

The Deputy the next day acquaints the Diet with the Paper, and a motion was prefently made, that it might be read, and fecurity given for the appearance of the authors but this was itrongly opposed by others, affi.ming, that fuch malitious Pasquils were not to be regarded, whole principal end was to create jealoufits; this grew to a great dispute, in which they spent much time to little purpole, and departed without any resolution.

This day the Astemply spent wholly all in diffures, informuch as little hopes remain of concluding any thing this Settion.

Eatisbonne, April 17. The City of Cologne has ient hither their Plenipotentiaries, who are very apprehenfive of the defigns of their Bifhap, feating left he may attempt them with an affiltance drawing from Erance and Bavaria.

We begin here also forewhat to doubt the intentions of the Duke of Bavaria in not permitting any boats to pass to this place, nor any Wood, or other Provisions to enter the City, but what is intended for the use of the Plenipotentiaries and Deputies belonging to the Diet.

The affairs of Hangu are not in to fair a way of fettlement as was imagined. The Prince Palatin of Birkenfeld, who is Tutor to the young Counts, is faid to have lately teiled on the upper County, putting Garrilons into the ftrong places, confifting of foldiers of t at Countrey; but a French Garifon into the House of Lichhtenberg.

Vienna, April 20. The Marquis de Bethane has in the name of the most Christian King his Mafter, offered the Emperour the affiltance of his forces for the reducing to obedience those who are entred into Arms againft him in Hungary 5 the faid Marquis was the 12th inftant honoursbly Treated by the Emperors chief Minister of State, and fince by leveral other Ministers and principal periors of the Courts A Turkish Chiaux has lately made fresh complaints against the Hullars, defining the punishment of the pretent offenders, and that care be taken to prevent future diforders.

The systemitiant the Emperour was informed by an express that as foon as the Imperial forces appeared within view of the Fort of Cathenthurs; the Count Serini and Marquie Frangipani made their estars; leaving the Garrilon to make their conditions, who immediately gave up the Keys of the Gates to the chief Commander, who matched in and took possibility of the Counter of the Emperor, where he found the Counters de Serini who had not an opportunity of accompanying the Court her Husbanil in his flight.

A fecond Courier arriving the fame day, brought Letters from the Count de Stra tzkowitz, a Noble perfon of Erdatias Julio is a. present at an Bithre of his about 20 Leagues Siftant from lience Informing his Imperial Majeity, that the Gount Scrint and Marquis Frangipani artived at his houle the Evening before with only 24 Horle, whom he fiss it ayed till he knew his Imperial Majesties farthet pleature, having fome fulpition that they intended for Upper Hungary, thought they protested they intended for Vienna to beg his Imperial Majefties patdon. Upon this welcome news, the Emperor ordered feveral Couriers to be difpatcht away, with Command, that the laid Count and Marquils mould be immediately brought hitler, Which was accordingly obeyd : the Count de Khery conducting them yesterday into this Town, where Count Serini was committed to the cuftody of the Deputy Governour ind the Malquis to the Major, where they expect the Emperors farther pleafure

The Imperial forces have also made themfelves Masters of Legrade! The Poople of upper Hungary are not yet, reduced to Obedience, they have littly under a pretence of a Treat felled on the Count de Sternemberg the Govetnor of Tockay: But the Nobility of Lower Hungary have antertained more Loyal thoughts, having in their Affembly in this City refolved, that If the others do not further by return to chelt Duty, they will joyn their Eolores with the Empetors and force them to it.

Bruffels: May 2. All the Towns in the French Conquests are filled with foldiers, and their Magazines stored with necellarites for a wat; in Dunkirk are 50 pieces of Artillery ready to march upon any occasion; but the assurances they give us, that they intend not to raile us any distrution this year, makes us not to apprehend any danger from this visit, which his most Christian Majesty is phealed to make to his new Conquests.

The Conflable rather prepates to affift then oppose him in his progress, and fast ordered feveral Bridger to be made for the convenient paffing over his forces, which the committed to the care of the Steur Ognate:

The Court departed as was inrended the 28 inflant from St Cornajat, and was the Iame day Maghificantly treated at Dinner at Chantilly by the Prince de Condd, and lodged thag night at Senliss's the next day beit Majeffiel ware Entertained at Perbrie by the Mar-

quis de Rare, and ledged that night at Complegne, and the next day went thence on their Progress.

The Count de Chamilly is atrived at Perpignan where he is to command the forces which are fent into Rouffillon to punish the rebellion of that people, and to teduce the Mountainers, who make frequent introades into the French Quarters.

The Sieur d'Almeras is with 4 men of War to attend the Turkish Envoye on his return home, and to carry over an Ambassador to succeed the Sieur de la Haye Ventelet in the Ottoman Court.

From Rome we have news of the death of Cardinal d' Elci, and that feveral other Cardinals are tick and indispoled, but asyst no hopes of an Election.

Portfmouth, April 26. Here is lately arrived the Advice Fregat from the Westwards, having upon the confident rumor of fome Turkish ships appearing upon the Coasts, been crussing in the Channel and about Hessians, speaking with all Vessels he could meet with, but from none of them could have any informations of the appearanc. If any Turks either in the Channel or the Soundings; he went after wards to Conquest Road in Brittagne, but neither from the Governor nor from any Ships trom St Maloes or other parts of France could learn any thing of them, but sather had an affurance that there came not any Turksmen of War with their St Maloes Fleet; is that the Report leems to have been railed upon designe for the advantages of some private perions.
