A Turkish Chiaux has lately made fresh complaints against the kinitages, defining the punishment of the present oftenders, and that care be taken to prevent suture disorders.

Upon this welcome news, the Emperor ordered several Couriers to be difparcht alway, with Command, that the laid Count and Marquis thould be immediately brought hitler, Which was accordingly obeyd : the Count de Khery conducting them yesterday into this Town, where Count Serini was committed to the custody of the Deputy Governour & shill the Malquis to the Major, where they expect the Emperors farther pleasure.

The Imperial forces have also made themselves Masters of Legrade! The Pdoble of upper Hungary are not yet reduced to Obedience; they have likely under a presence of a Treat selsed on the Count de Sternemberg the Governor of Tocker: But the Nobility of Lower Hungary have antertained more Loyal thoughts, having in their Afferboly in this City resolved, that is the others do not succeed by return to chest Duty, they will joyn their Eorces with the Emperors and force them to it.

Portsmouth, April 26. Here is lately arrived the Advice Fregat from the Westwards, having upon the confident rumor of some Turkish ships appearing upon the Coasts, been crussing in the Channel and about Heysans, speaking with all Vessels he could meet with, but from none of them could have any informations of the appearance of any Turks either in the Channel or the Soundings; he went afterwards to Conquest Road in Brittagne, but neither from the Governor nor from any Ships from St Maloes or other parts of France could learn any thing of them, but sather had an assurance that there came not any Turks men of War with their St Maloes Fleet; so that the Report seems to have been railed upon designe for the advantages of some private persons.
