Notice is hereby given that on the 20th November 1974, the Wiltshire County Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, and Schedule 19 of the Local Government Act 1972, the effect of which is that no person shall ride or cause or permit to be ridden any bicycle or tricycle on Footpath No. 23, Laverstock, which lies between Woodland Way and Westfield Close.

Notice is hereby given that on the 20th November 1974, the Wiltshire County Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, and Schedule 19 of the Local Government Act 1972, the effect of which is that no person shall ride or cause or permit to be ridden any bicycle or tricycle on that length of footpath between Aragon Close-Hudson Road and Holders Road, Amesbury.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT

The County of Wiltshire (Woolley Street/Holt Road Junction, Bradford on Avon) (Prohibition of 'Right-Hand Turn and One Way) Order, 1974.

Notice is hereby given that on the 20th November 1974, the Wiltshire County Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, and Schedule 19 of the Local Government Act 1972, the effect of which is as follows:

1. That no person shall cause any vehicle proceeding along Holt Road in a north-westerly direction to make a right-hand turn into that part of Woolley Street between Holt Road and New Road, Bradford on Avon.
2. That the length of Woolley Street from its junction with Holt Road to a point approximately 80 metres (88 yards) north-east of that junction shall be subject to "one-way", with vehicles only travelling in a north-easterly direction.

WILTSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT, 1967

The County of Wiltshire (Various Roads, Southwick) (30 m.p.h. Speed Limit) Order, 1974

Notice is hereby given that on the 20th November 1974 the Wiltshire County Council made an Order under section 72(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1968, as amended by Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act, 1972, the effect of which is that the following lengths of road in Southwick shall be subject to a speed limit of 30 m.p.h.:

- (1) *Wynsome Street*: From its junction with the Trowbridge/Frome road (A.361) in a south-westerly direction, to a point 130 metres south-east of its junction with Blind Lane.
- (2) *Blind Lane*: The complete length.
- (3) *Wesley Lane*: From its junction with the Trowbridge/Frome road (A.361), in a south-westerly direction, to a point 30 metres south-east of its junction with Blind Lane.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in the Order on the ground that it is not within the powers of the relevant section of the above Act or on the ground that any requirement of that section or of section 84A, 84B or 84C of the Act or any regulations made under the said section 84C has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within six weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
