

lay at Malstrand, waiting to Convoy some Merchantmen that are expected from the East-Sea to Great Britain; and that the Swedes are fitting out four large Privateers at Gottenburg, with a Design to intercept one Danish Vessel which is expected from East India, and another that is ready to sail that way.

*Hague, January 28. N. S.* Frequent Conferences are held here between the Deputies of the States-General and the Ministers of the Allies, concerning the necessary Dispositions of the ensuing Campaign; and it appearing by the Preparations of the Enemy that they design to augment their Troops in Alsatia, and to push on the War against Germany with greater Vigour than hitherto they have done, no Methods have been omitted to engage the Princes of the Empire to exert their utmost Endeavours for the Security of their Country; and we hope, that by the timely Reinforcements which his Imperial Majesty hath promised to send to the Upper Rhine, the Designs of the Enemy will be frustrated, and the Allies enabled to carry on the War with Success on that Frontier. The States of Holland have not yet filled up the Vacancies in the Military List; but those Offices will be disposed of at their next Assembly. Great Magazines are laid up in all the Frontier Towns against next Spring; and all other Measures have been taken for a vigorous and early Campaign. Our last Advices from Paris say, that the Duke of Burgundy, the Duke of Orleans, the Duke of Bavaria, and the Duke of Berwick, are Competitors for the Command of the French Army in Flanders this next Year; his Majesty had not yet thought fit to declare himself in that Affair, but if the Duke of Villars recovers of his Wounds, it is supposed he will be continued in that Post. Letters from Spain say, that General Staremberg had possessed himself of a considerable Post on the Frontiers of Arragon, whereby he had cut off the Communication between that City and the Enemy.

*Whitehaven, January 18.* This Day the Delight of this Port, John Shepherd Master, arrived from Virginia, but last from Glasgow.

*Plymouth, January 20.* On the 18th Instant came in the Unity Transport of this Place from Roscoe. This Day came in the Windsor of Topsham from Selo with Wine, and a Genoese from St. Lucas, laden with Fruit, and both bound for London; as also two Swedes and two Dutch Ships with Salt from France, and a Dutch Privateer from cruising.

*Dartmouth, January 20.* On the 17th Instant came into Saltcomb, three Leagues to the Westward of this Place, the Prince of Plymouth, Robert Williams Master, from Rotterdam, bound for Lisbon, being chased into Saltcomb by a French Privateer. The 18th came in here the Three Friends of Rotterdam, Capt. Egmont Commander, from St. Maloes, laden with Brandy, bound for Amsterdam. The Master reports, That the Scarcity of Corn in those Parts is still very great. The Peterborough Galley from Barcelona, bound for London, continues here.

*St. James's, January 21.* Her Majesty has been pleased to appoint Robert Walpole, Esq; to be Treasurer of the Navy, in the room of Sir Thomas Littleton, Bart. deceased, and a Patent has passed the Seals accordingly.
