PUBLIC HEALTH ACTS AND CLEAN AIR ACT

CALDERDALE BOROUGH COUNCIL

CLEAN AIR ACT 1956

The Calderdale (Ripponden) (No. 1) Smoke Control Order 1974

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of Calderdale in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on the 4th December 1974 made an Order entitled the Calderdale (Ripponden) (No. 1) Smoke Control Order, 1974, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment.

Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act, if on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20, unless he proves that the emissions of smoke were not caused by the use of fuel other than authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

Also in accordance with the Clean Air Act, 1968, section 9 (1), any person who:

- (a) acquires any solid fuel, other than an authorised fuel, for use in a building in a smoke control area otherwise than in a building or fireplace exempted;
- or
- (b) acquires any solid fuel, other than an authorised fuel, for use in a boiler or plant to which this paragraph applies in a smoke control area, not being a boiler or plant so exempted;
- or
- (c) sells by retail any solid fuel other than an authorised fuel, for delivery by his or on his behalf to a building in a smoke control area, or to premises in such an area in which there is a boiler or plant to which paragraph (b) applies, shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £20.

If confirmed, the Order will not come into operation before the 1st October 1975, or before a later date determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Chief Administrative Officer's Department, Town Hall, Halifax at all reasonable times during the period of 6 weeks from the 6th January 1975.

Within the said period, any person who will be affected by the Order may, by notice in writing to the Secretary, Department of the Environment, 2 Marsham Street, London, SW1P 3EB, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

The area commences with the former Sowerby Bridge Urban District boundary at Salt Drake Bridge, follows the line of Cotton Stones Ghyll in an easterly direction, passing to the south of the village of Mill Bank, crosses the Halifax Road at Kebroyd Bridge, proceeds generally to a point north-east of High Lea Top. The boundary of the area then turns in a southerly direction and down Scammoden Road to a property known as Cross Royd, turning to the south-west along Greetland Road, following the road into Ripponden to join with the Halifax Road in the centre of the village. The boundary then turns westerly following Royd Lane, Lighthazels Road, turning north at Blackshaw Clough, follows the line of Lighthazels Road past Spring Rock, Four Lane Ends, reaching the commencement point of Salt Drake Bridge.
