The Borough of Hartlepool No. 29 Smoke Control Order 1974

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of Hartlepool in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on the 24th January 1975 made an Order entitled the Borough of Hartlepool No. 29 Smoke Control Order 1974 declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of

State for the Environment for confirmation.

2. Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

3. If confirmed the Order will not come into operation before the 1st November 1975 or before a later date determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

- 4. Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the office of the Chief Executive, Municipal Buildings, Hartlepool at all reasonable times during the period of 6 weeks from the 30th January
- 1975.
 5. Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may give notice in writing to the Secretary of State for the Environment, 2 Marsham Street, London, SWIP 3EB, objecting to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULES

The area shall be that part of the Borough of Hartlepool bounded by the centre of Powlett Road, the main Hartlepool to Sunderland railway line, north-eastwards along the dis-used railway embankment, the centre of Old Cemetery Road, then via the tunnel road along the centre of Winterbottom Avenue which area is more particularly shown coloured green on the map sealed with the Common Seal of the Hartlepool Borough Council and marked "Map referred to in the Borough of Hartlepool No. 29 Smoke Control Order 1974".
