The Trunk Road (Western Avenue, Cardiff) (Prohibition of U-Turns) Order, 1975

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State intends to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be that no person shall cause or permit any vehicle proceeding in either an easterly direction or a westerly direction, as the case may be, in that length of road specified in the Schedule below, to make a U-turn so as to proceed in the opposite direction in either an easterly or a westerly direction, as the case may be.

SCHEDULE

That length of the London-Fishguard Trunk Road (A.48) known as Western Avenue in the City of Cardiff, in the County of South Glamorgan, which extends from its junction with Aberporth Road in a westerly direction to the centre point of the mini-roundabout at the junction with Cardiff Road and Llandaff Road, a distance of 1,317 yards.
