## Y SWYDDFA GYMREIG

## TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 212 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, for extinguishing any rights which persons may have to use vehicles on those lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

The proposed Order will contain provisions for permitting the use of those highways by vehicles being used:

- (a) in pursuance of statutory powers or duties if that vehicle cannot be conveniently used for such purpose in any other road; or
- (b) in accordance with the special authorisation for that use given by or on behalf of the County Council of Gwent, the Borough Council of Torfaen or the Chief Officer of Police for the Gwent Constabulary.

During 28 days from the 28th February 1975, copies of the draft Order and relevant plan may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Torfaen Borough Council, Council Offices, Pontypool and may be obtained free of charge from the Secretary of State (quoting the reference number WR15/35/2) at the address stated below.

Within the above-mentioned period of 28 days any person may by notice to the Secretary of State, Welsh Office, Roads Division (Y Swyddfa Gymreig, Adran Ffyrdd), Graham Buildings, 139 Newport Road, Cardiff, CF2 1YU, object to the making of the Order (quoting the reference number WR15/34/2) and stating the grounds of objection.

## SCHEDULE

Description of highways to which this notice relates (the distances stated are approximate). The highways are situated in the Borough of Torfaen, in the County of Gwent and are:

1. That length of Crumlin Street which extends from its junction with Capel Street to a point 36 yards north of that junction;
2. That length of Nicholas Street which extends from a point 15 yards north of its junction with Capel Street to a point 27 yards north of that junction; and
3. That length of John Street which extends from its junction Lower Park Terrace to a point 19 yards south of that junction.

## HIGHWAYS ACTS 1959 TO 1971

*The St. Clears-Nash (South Pembrokeshire) Trunk Road (Castle Heli Bridge Diversion) Order, 1975*

*The St. Clears-Nash (South Pembrokeshire) Trunk Road (Castle Heli Bridge Diversion Side Roads) Order, 1975*

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that in relation to the above-mentioned trunk road at Castle Heli in the county of Dyfed he has made under the Highways Act 1959:

1. An Order under section 7 which provides:

(a) that a road which he proposes to construct at Castle Heli in the county of Dyfed shall become part of the St. Clears-Nash (South Pembrokeshire) Trunk Road as from the date when the Order comes into operation, and

(b) that the length of the existing trunk road to be superseded by the construction of the road shall cease to be a trunk road as from the date on which notice is given by him to the County Council of Dyfed (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the new length of trunk road is open for through traffic, and

2. An Order under section 9 of the Highways Act 1959 authorising him:

(a) to stop up parts of the superseded trunk road,

(b) to construct a new highway to connect the new length of the trunk road with the above superseded length of the trunk road,

all at Castle Heli Bridge aforesaid, and providing for the transfer of the said new highway mentioned in 2 (b) above to the County Council of Dyfed as from the date on which the Secretary of State notifies the Council that the new highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.

Copies of the Orders and of the relevant plans have been deposited at the Welsh Office, Cathays Park, Cardiff and at the offices of Dyfed County Council, County Hall, Carmarthen and South Pembrokeshire District Council, District Council Office, The Old Town Hall, Narberth where they are open to inspection free of charge at all reasonable hours.

Any person aggrieved by the Orders and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959 or the Highways Act 1971 or on the ground that any requirement of either of those Acts, or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Orders, may within 6 weeks from 28th February 1975, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Orders or of any provision contained therein.

And the petitioners by their counsel undertaking within fourteen days of the restoration of the name of the company to the register increase the number of members of the company to not less than two and within one month of the restoration of the name of the company to the register of companies to forward to the Registrar of Companies as required by sections 124 and 126 of the above-mentioned Act, a copy of the annual return of the company for each of the years 1967 to 1970 inclusive and 1972 and 1973 together with the documents annexed thereto as required by section 127 of the said Act and to send to the Registrar of Companies as required by section 200 of the said Act a notification of any change among the directors of the company or in its secretary or in any of the particulars contained in its said register specifying the date of the change

This Court doth order that the name of the above named Minters Business Agency Limited be restored to the register of companies
